

ISRAEL CENSORS DISENGAGEMENT BOOK

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israeli military censors have banned the publication of a book by Matti Golan, diplomatic correspondent of Haaretz, because the army feels the book was "full of secret and top secret material" which could prejudice the State.

The book contains what are purportedly verbatim transcripts of private conversations between former Premier Golda Meir and Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger during the negotiations that led to the disengagement agreement between Israel and Egypt in January, 1974. The censorship was not officially acknowledged until the New York Times published a story on the censorship and the book's alleged contents.

Haaretz said Golan was seeking legal advice as to whether he should challenge the ban in the Supreme Court, but was meanwhile complying with an order to turn over his manuscript and all notes and documents relating to the book to the government. According to the New York Times' Jerusalem correspondent, Terence Smith, Golan's book contains

disparaging remarks Kissinger made to Mrs. Meir about leaders of Egypt, Syria, the Soviet Union, Japan, and other countries.

The decision to ban the book was reportedly taken after extensive deliberations by the Cabinet. Premier Yitzhak Rabin reportedly told the Cabinet the revelations in the book would cause a rupture between the U.S. and Israel and the U.S. would hereafter refuse to assume any mediating role in the Mideast because it could not be assured of confidentiality of private communications.

In Kansas City, Kissinger told a press conference he had been informed about the book and he was not "particularly worried" about the development. He said it would not "affect negotiations with the Arab countries or the Soviets" on the Mideast.

Another press-government controversy has arisen about a report in the Jerusalem post from its Washington correspondent, Wolf Blitzer, listing 12 "Egyptian concessions" during the recent bilateral talks with Israel which Kis-

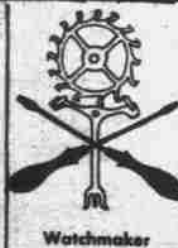
