## \$100,000 SHOWER OF MONEY HIGHLIGHTS SUMMER SAHARA CELEBRATION

It's Summer Super Sahara Celebration time again at Del Webb's Hotel Sahara, where more than 8,000 cash prizes are being given away in 14 days of craziness.

Headlining the event is a Super Grand Prize Drawing for \$5,000 -- but that's just a fraction of the total amount which will be divvied up in twice-hourly drawings, special games and \$100,000 "showers." The drawing will be held at 6 p.m. on Sunday, June 15, to conclude the celebration. If the winner is present at the drawing, he or she will receive

\$5,000 in crisp greenbacks. If not present, the winner will still receive a check for \$2,000.00.

Another top attraction -- always the most exciting event on the Celebration schedule for both contestants and spectators -- is the \$100,000 Shower of Money, held every night at 10 p.m. Each night, tickets are drawn from the master drum until a winner is present. The contestant is dressed in a special jumpsuit -- no pockets!! -- and escorted into a plexiglass "shower." There, he or she is showered with \$100,000 in cash, with

players are chosen randomly to play a special "Golden Super Slot" machine free for 1/2 hour -- keeping any and all winnings. For Keno players, "Super Keno" is played six times daily, with some lucky player winning at least \$100 on a free 10-spot ticket.

Even Black ack, Poker, Pan, Big 6 and Roulette players get in on the fun each day at 5:30, when a "Lucky Casino Table" is drawn from a giant fishbowl. Every player at that lucky table receives \$10 in gaming chips, regardless of the size of his or her bet.

Other Super Sahara Celebration activities center around the Sahara's generous slot machines, which are more generous than ever around Celebration time. Eight times daily, beginning at 3 p.m., there are special time periods during which any jackpot winner is paid double. And six times a day, three lucky slot

billings ranging from \$5 to \$1,000. The winner gets to keep every bill he or she can push through a slot in 60 seconds.

The record "take" by a Shower of Money contestant is \$2,700 -- a figure which every lucky contestant is shooting at this year.
