In the Kibbutzim the young people are assured of food and rudimentary accommodation if they will do a day's work. But the work is like no other kind they have undertaken, tougher than the toughest exam and more idealistic than marching. A blonde girl on Kibbutz Sasa in the heights of Galilee said while digging at a stretch of rocky ground, "We're making a lawn. We're making green things grow with our own hands. It's a terrific experience."

A boy wandered into the office of the Kibbutz and asked to work... do just any work to stay. He gazed with mute hero-worship at the taciturn Kibbutznik who said without lifting his eyes, "They need volunteers at Malkiya." "Malkiya...!" exclaimed the boy with a thrill in his voice, "That's five kilometres from the Lebanese border..."

....And anyone who talks about the right of

nationalities and religions, students, hippies,
members of Evangelical sects, tough guys from members of Evangelical sects, tough guys from the Jewish Defense League. The world has not grasped how important Jerusalem has become as a meeting-place for youth from many nations.

Israel may be demoralized and misunder-Israel may be demoralized and misunder-stood by most of the world and torn by internal troubles. But when young people from all over the world flock to her beleaguered borders, she can hold up her head. The young people seek-ing identity find a message in Israel. Maybe the UN and the nations who uphold it should absorb the fact that not all the younger generaabsorb the fact that not all the younger genera-tion are on the side of Arafat.


