GOLDMANN WARNS OF DANGER TO ALL JEWS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Dr. Nahum Goldmann, president of the World Jewish Congress, opened the WJC's Sixth Plenary Assembly, with a declaration that "the number one problem of Jewish foreign policy is to secure the survival and future of Israel." Dr. Goldmann stressed that "every Jew, in my opinion, is entitled to express his views about Israel's policies, but when it comes to the final conclusion he has the duty to stand by Israel, even if he is not in accord with its policies."

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- As Egypt reopened the Suez Canal for the first time since the Six-Day War, Israel prepared to test the right of passage for its cargo through the waterway.

Transportation Minister Gad Yaacobi said that a Liberian vessel carrying 12,000 tons of sugar from South Korea to Israel will attempt to pass through the canal. Israeli officials have stressed that passage through the canal was an understanding of the January 1974 Israeli-Egyptian disengagement agreement.

Foreign Minister Yigal Allon told the Knesset that the Israeli government welcomed the reopening of the canal, noting that it had been one of the understandings of the disengagement accord. But he stressed that Israel has "the right to expect that it would have full freedom of access for its cargoes as agreed to in the disengagement accords."

Premier Yitzhak Rabin said in a television interview that if Cairo refuses to allow Israeli cargoes through the canal, Israel will bring the

RABBIS CRITICIZE ISRAEL

Over 60 American rabbis have criticized current Israeli foreign policy as "unwise and ineffective" in a series of national advertisements which appear this week in New Republic magazine, The American Jewish Congress Monthly, and The Jewish Week. The rabbis, including some of the most prominent in the American Jewish community, are all supporters of Breira (Alternative), a national Jewish organization which is attempting to provide a forum for dissent within the American Jewish community.

The Breira-sponsored advertisements urge the Israeli government to adopt a four point "peace plan" to break the current diplomatic deadlock and to establish a framework within which concerned Jews can work more effectively to defend Israel's just claim to recognition and security within the Arab world. The plan, drafted by Yozma (Initiative), an influential group of Israeli political and cultural personalities, journalists, kibbutz members and academics, calls for Israeli withdrawal from the Arab territory occupied by Israel in the 1967 War and the establishment of an independent Palestinian State on the West Bank of the Jordan and in the Gaza Strip in exchange for Arab recognition of Israel and a peace treaty. Also, Jerusalem should remain a unified city, with proper steps to guarantee privileges of three faiths and special arrangements for inhabitation by Jews and Arabs.

(ED. NOTE: Many good, solid, respected American Jews endorse this plan to break the deadlock, including leaders of World Jewish Congress, U.A.H.C., and B'nai B'rith Hillel. Before we agree with them we ask two questions. (1) If Israel relinquishes its protective borders, how do we know for certain the Arabs will honor the terms of the treaty? (2) Should not the Israelis, and only the Israelis, determine their own destiny? JACK TELL.)

Our exposure, last week, of false and misleading advertising in the sale of condominiums brought out complaints from the State Attorney General, the District Attorney and the Consumers Affairs Division of the Department of Commerce.

Judge Joseph Pavlikowski signed a temporary restraining order prohibiting real estate agents of the development from discussing prices or negotiating contracts. The state claimed Barclay Square officials were using "bait and switch" technique to lure in potential buyers through a heavy media bombardment that said housing units could be obtained with only a \$45 down payment.
