ISRAEL REDUCES TROOPS, ARMS IN SINAI

contribution in light of the canal's reopening, toward pacification of the region."

The thinning included reducing OUT by half the 7000 soldiers allowed in the ''limited forces zone' the east of the canal, pulling back 15 of the 30 permitted tanks and all artillery within 32 kilometers of the canal, and all missiles from a 40-mile strip east of the canal.

The move was wel comed in Israel and abroad. Secretary of Henry State Α. Kissinger told press conference in Salzburg that Rabin's announcement was "constructive move." But, he added, "no unilateral step can be decisive, but it is helpful." However, the Soviet


