
HADASSAN PROVES ISRAEL'S HEALTH SERVICE TO ARABS BEST IN

NEW YORK -- Condemning members of the World Health Organization for politically motivated criticism of Israel's health services to residents of the administered areas, Rose E. Matzkin, President of Hadassah, said:

Matzkin, President of Hadassah, said: "The Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center in Jerusalem provides open-heart sur-gery, kidney dialysis and other sophisticated and costly medical services to the Arab popu-lation of Gaza, the West Bank and even Jordan, in addition to providing primary health care services in hospitals and clinics. "As a matter of fact," Mrs. Matzkin says, "Arabs from the neighboring Arab countries regularly come to Hadassah through contacts they have with relatives living in Israel and the West Bank, and they are welcomed.

"Hadassah doctors work side-by-side with Arab doctors in the Children's Hospital at Ramallah and in clinics in the West Bank...As U.S. administrator for the Food for Peace Program, Hadassah distributes food supple-ments such as dried milk and eggs, to Arab institutions to raise the nutritional level for children, pregnant women, and the sick and and all of this has naid off in the children, pregnant women, and the sick and aged. "You can understand, therefore, how shocked we are that, despite the report of the W.H.O. investigator approving of Israel's health services in these areas, that members of the W.H.O. would condemn Israel."
