JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Yirzhak Rabin returned to Israel from Washington and declared that he hoped all the participants had learned that no negotiations could be carried out for an Israeli-Egyptian interim agreement until all sides had settled about 90 percent of their differences first.

Rabin stressed that if Egyptian President Anwar Sadat wants peace "now is the time to do it." He said Israel's position was the come to do it." He said Israel's position was thoroughly explained in the United States. "I would not say that all I said was accepted by the Americans, but at the same time not everything that was said by the Americans was accepted by me," he noted.

Meanwhile Rabin's office angrily denied a report in Maariv that Rabin and President Ford had reached a "secret agreement" in Washington on an interim agreement between Israel and Egypt. The Cabinet adopted a resolution endorsing the continutation of negotiations for an interim agreement. The resolution stipulated that the negotiations would be conducted according to the positions approved by the Cabinet before Rabin's departure for Washington.

The two Independent Liberal party ministers, Moshe Kol and Gideon Hausner, abstained, arguing that negotiations should not be left solely to Rabin, Foreign Minister Yigal Allon, and Defense Minister Shimon Peres. They also objected to negotiations for an interim
