

## JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- Two new absorption centers will be opened soon for immigrants without college education.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- Foreign Minister Yigal Allon has voiced Israel's concern to British Ambassador Sir Bernard Ledwidge over reports of a massive British-Egyptian arms deal, totalling near half a billion Pounds Sterling.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- The fifth anniversary of the June 15, 1970 mass arrest of Soviet Jews which led to the Leningrad trials of 1970 and 1971 was marked by Jews in and out of the USSR.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** -- Haim Ben Shazar, the economics professor who headed the committee which has proposed reforms in Israel's income tax laws, has been installed as president of Tel Aviv University.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** -- Israel won fifth place in the Asian Games in Seoul South Korea by winning two gold, one silver and three bronze medals.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** -- Two Israelis were killed and six injured after terrorists invaded a home in the village of Kfar Yuval near the Lebanon border.

**WASHINGTON (WNS)** -- Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger told Israeli Premier Yitzhak Rabin that "We could never live with ourselves if we had impaired the well being and security of Israel."

**ANN ARBOR, MICHIGAN (LNS)** -- A new Chabad-Lubavitch house has been opened on the campus of the University of Michigan.

**CINCINNATI, OHIO** -- Dr. Eugene Mihaly, Professor of Rabbinic Literature and Homiletics at Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion, has been appointed as the Academic Coordinator of the Institution's four schools in this city, New York, Los Angeles and Jerusalem.

**NEW YORK** -- Dr. Max M. Kampelman was re-elected President of the American Friends of the Hebrew University.

**NEW YORK** -- A collection of more than 10,000 volumes, including unique items and complete sets of virtually all periodicals of the 19th and 20th centuries concerning Jewish scholarship, valued at half million dollars, has been presented to the library of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America by Professor Lieberman, who is Rector of the Seminary's Rabbinical School and distinguished service research professor of Talmud, and have been purchased by him throughout a lifetime of study.

**WASHINGTON (WNS)** -- August Stern, the son of Dr. Mikhail Stern, has appealed to President Ford to urge Soviet authorities to grant clemency to his father who is serving an eight-year sentence in a Soviet labor camp.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- The government announced a two percent devaluation of the Israeli Pound, the second devaluation since last fall when the Pound was reduced in value nearly 42 percent.

**MELBOURNE (WNS)** -- The Palestine Liberation Organization has failed to get permission from the Australian government to open a PLO information office.

**WASHINGTON (WNS)** -- The Spanish government has made as a condition for the renewal of American air and naval bases in Spain a stipulation that the U.S. will not be allowed to use Spanish territory as a stopover point for military supplies being taken to Israel.

**WASHINGTON (WNS)** -- Sen. Richard S. Schweiker (D. Pa.) is leading Congressional opposition against the continuing of payment of United States contributions to the International Labor Organization because the ILO granted observer status to the Palestine Liberation Organization.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- The American Jewish Congress and the American Jewish Committee have announced that discussions between the two organizations on the possibility of merging has been discontinued.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- Representatives of 1000 immigrant families from the United States have protested rent increases, with the support of Mrs. Charlotte Jacobson, chairman of the American Section of the World Zionist Organization.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- The David Ben Gurion University of the Negev at Beersheba has been given a grant by an anonymous donor to establish a fund for Yiddish Culture Studies at the University. It was announced by Ambassador Yosef Tekoah, who is leaving his United Nations post to become President of the University.

## RESURGENCE OF VILE KU KLUX KLAN

**MINNEAPOLIS, MN. (WUP)** -- The Minneapolis Tribune, in reporting on the appearance in the Twin Cities of a Ku Klux Klan leader who attacked both blacks and Jews, received scores of protesting letters from its readers, two of which were published in the May 31 issue.

Mary Quenette of St. Paul wrote:

"On May 20, James Warner, publisher of the right wing newspaper, Christian Vanguard, and grand dragon of California's Ku Klux Klan, brought his brand of hatred in our Twin Cities. In a speech, he labeled the Jews and the blacks as 'termites' and 'the children of the devil' and made threats against them.

"Has the stench of the ovens taught us nothing about racism and its logical conclusion? I am white and a Christian,

and it cannot be stated emphatically enough that Warner does not speak for Christians...."

Two other readers, David and Erica Foster, of Minneapolis, were indignant. They wrote:

"The vicious anti-Negro, anti-Jewish and anti-labor stands of the KKK should be severely condemned by everything decent and honest in all of us. Let us be clear. These are the fascists we fought in World War II. Many of us stood in line to get a chance to fight Hitler.

"Unfortunately, the reappearance of the Klan and like-minded groups is not isolated to Minneapolis.

Throughout the country there is a resurgence of these vile groupings... We must not be fooled. It happened in Germany. It can happen here...."
