Cautious Signs

Those who expected an agreement between Israel and Egypt to immediately follow Premier Yitzhak Rabin's visit to Washington are of course disappointed. The fact still remains that until Egypt demonstrates she is willing to make concessions, as Israel is, no agreement can be reached.

But the Rabin meetings with President Ford and Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger did result in a public relaxation of the tension that had built up between Israel and the United States since Kissinger's "shuttle diplomacy" broke down last March. There was an exchange of views and an apparent understanding of each other's position. As Rabin said upon his return to Israel: "I would not want to say that all I said was accepted by the Americans, but at the same time not everything said by the Americans was accepted by me." This is as it should be.

Added to this were Kissinger's warm words at a dinner for Rabin in which he called differences between Israel and the United States "merely family quarrels." Kissinger also expressed American understanding that any mistake in the negotiations could lead to dire consequences for the Israelis.

This does not mean that the situation is still not tense. The Ford Administration still wants very badly to reach an agreement between Israel and Egypt. But perhaps this new publicly expressed understanding, backed by the strong support for Israel in Congress, will cause the Administration to think twice before attempting to pressure Israel into taking steps the Jewish State feels would endanger her security.

based on recent developments which, on the surface, do indeed appear to justify the hopes expressed.

Behind all this, of course, are the meetings President Ford had held with Egypt's Sadat and Israel's Rabin under the ever watchful eye of Henry Kissinger.

Moreover, did not Assad of Syria renew the mandate of UNDOF for another six long months affording a breathing-spell for further talks?

And have not the Soviets 'shelved' their hitherto demanding plans for the resumption of the Geneva Conference -- made more explicit following the recent Gromyko-Kissinger confabs in Vienna?

Something, therefore, is brewing towards what seems like some Egyptian-Israeli 'compromise' step in the Sinai as maneuvered by Washington.

And did not Sadat reactivate his 'ditch'? And, later, when Premier Rabin ordered a further token withdrawal of his troops in the Sinai as a gesture of reciprocation did not Sadat, as seen on television, appear in a 'surprising joyful mood'?

And from Washington, Times news analyst Bernard Gwertzman reports that "Mr. Sadat is viewed here as a moderate, a man of considerable courage in turning his country toward the West and away from Moscow, and someone who can be trusted."

"Some who can be trusted?"
Have we all forgotten the infamy of the Yom Kippur War? Let us beware of trickery! Is not this the man who had links with Hitler and later praised him? Anwar Sadat is clever and he is playing a sinister game, exploiting both the East and the West. True, he poses as a 'moderate' and that is within the scenario of his game.

And what are the Soviets up to? Why have they so suddenly changed their minds about a hasty Geneva convocation? Is it because of Arab disunity and fear of failure of the wider talks? Or is it because they know something the West is unaware of? And what do they know? Do they know what they knew before the Yom Kippur war -- that the Arabs would embark upon their infamous onslaught--and failed to alert their partner-in-detente?

And what is Moscow's heavily armed client Syria up to? What is behind the military pact Assad entered into with King Hussein who, of late, has become persona-grata with the USSR?

Yes, let us emphasize again -- It behooves the United States and Israel to beware of the trickery. During the Vietnam tragedy, the Soviets and their friends gloated over the fact that America had drained its resources in Indochina resulting in an internal crisis at home out of which the nation has not yet emerged.

Today, Moscow gloats over the fact that Arab oil has replaced Vietnam in stifling the American economy.

It has become clear, therefore, that the Middle East conflict is one which interests the Russians more than it does the parties concerned or the United States. Moscow is determined to dominate the Arab world via Syria, Iraq and even Egypt which is so tragically mortgaged to the Russians that it will find itself beholden to them for many

The tragedy in all this lies in the fact that the Arab states are not only heavily armed by the USSR but also, although to a lesser extent, by the United States which believes -- by putting pressures on Israel to meet their demands-- will win their friendship. King Hussein's latest action with Syria ought to teach Washington a good lesson.

In the light of the above facts -- certainly known to the Israelis -- it becomes understandable why Premier Yitzhak Rabin, during his meetings with Ford and Kissinger last week had remained adamant in refusing to budge from the set Israeli position and why, prior to his visit here, he had appointed General Arik Sharon, the hero of the Yom Kippur War, as his personal military adviser.
