

**KURDISH MISFORTUNE A BLOW TO FREE WORLD**

NEW YORK (WUP) -- In a letter published in The New York Times, writer Omran Yahya Felli warned that "the recent turn of events against the Kurdish resistance should be taken very seriously by our friends in the Middle East, especially by the Israelis and the Iranians. There are two lessons to be learned from the misfortunes of the Kurdish resistance," he emphasized.

"First, if a nation does not have money and manpower, it cannot benefit from the blessings of international law, the Charter of the UN, or any of its resolutions.

"Second, the Arab influence has grown so immense that it now can deflect both the West and the East from their traditional policies and sometimes from their traditional beliefs, as evidenced by the successful isolation of the Kurdish resistance.

"Armed with religious and ideological claims of supremacy and self-righteousness in its belief in conquest to a degree reaching a neurotic claim, Mr. Felli continued, "Arab nationalism stresses that the Arabs are a

people with an eternal mission to spread Arabism.

"With this mentality, coupled with trillions of dollars of petrol power to further its aims, Arab nationalism for years to come will be the biggest menace in Western Asia. No doubt the cost of existence for such states as Israel, Lebanon and Iran will be so immense that it might not be within their ability to withstand the coming pressure (though, in the short run, Iran may have gained some peace).

"The Kurdish resistance," the writer concluded, "provided an opportunity to offset this threat, but unfortunately this opportunity has been lost. I am sure that most friends of peace in the Middle East will regret it. I hope that wisdom will finally prevail and that the friends of the Kurds, especially the Shah of Iran, will see to it that aid is resumed to the Kurds, if not for humanitarian reasons then at least for the sake of territorial integrity of Iran."

\*NOTE: Many area people believe Nevada Power Company rates are low because we secure a high percentage of power from Hoover Dam. This is not true. Only 5% of Nevada Power Company capacity is from Hoover. The rest is coal-generated (60%), gas or oil generated (30%), or purchased (5%).
