WASHINGTON (WNS) -- In an unusual and angry statement that implied criticism of Israel, President Ford declared that the United States would not compete with leaks in diplomacy affecting a Middle East settlement.

His statement read by State Department spokesman Robert Anderson referred to an article by the Jerusalem correspondent of the New York Times which reported an Israeli offer for a second-stage agreement with the Egyptians accompanied by maps. According to the Times, Israel has offered Egypt a land corridor to the Abu Rodeis oilfields and an Israeli withdrawal from the western part of the Gidi and Mitla passes in return for an Egyptian commitment not to use force for three or four

Ford's statement declared that the U.S. "will not get into the business of competitive leaks of confidential diplomatic exchanges. The mans that appeared in the New York Times are inaccurate and highly misleading. We would caution anyone from drawing any conclusions from these press accounts.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Ambassador Simcha Dinitz has been called home from Washington for consultations as a major confrontation between Israel and the United States appears to be brewing, the "moment of truth" as one observer put it. Israel Radio reported that Ford had accepted Egypt's demand that Israel must completely evacuate the Gidi and Mitla Passes and that an Israeli agreement to this must come soon or there will be a return to the Geneva conference. Defense Minister Shimon Peres, who, along with Rabin and Allon, is conducting the negotiations, said if Israel gave up the passes she would no longer have a defense line in the Sinai Sinai.

When President Ford said he was going to reassess the Mideast policy, we were reminded of the deep-South sheriff, who told a mob of lynch-set Whites, "we'll give the Black man a fair trial and hang him in the morning."

And we weren't too far off.
The "reassessment" Ford still keeps talking about is nothing more than a condemnation of Israel. Each step of the way, whether it is a meeting of Ford and Sadat, or a meeting of Ford and Rabin, Israel seems to come out on the short end. No matter how many concessions Israel offers, it never is enough for Ford (and Kissingary who apparently want full compliance Kissinger) who apparently want full compliance with Egypt's conditions. And what are Egypt's conditions?

Merely the return of all land with no guarantee

for peace.
Ford's continuous warning of not permitting a "stalemate or stagnation" in the Mideast, is strictly a one-sided threat to Israel. Secretary of State Kissinger proved that in a recent speech and news conference in Atlanta.

Kissinger talked about protecting ALL U.S. interests in the Mideast, starting with the commitment to Israel's survival, which may or may not be borne out by other points listed. Kissinger said we have to protect American interests in the Arab world, for which the U.S. oil companies must have stood up and cheered.

Then Kissinger said the eruption of a crisis would strain U.S. relations with Europe and Japan. For this, of course, he was willing to sacrifice Israel. How generous.
