

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

VIENNA (WNS) -- Simon Wiesenthal, director of the Jewish Documentation Center, has revealed that Walter Kutschmann, a former SS officer now living in Argentina, was responsible for the execution of 20 Polish university professors in Poland during World War II.

NEW YORK -- The Golden Jubilee Pharmacy Award of the American Friends of the Hebrew University was presented to Jerome A. Weinberger, President of Gray Drug Stores, Inc. of Cleveland.

NEW YORK -- Albert D. Chernin, newly-elected professional head of the National Jewish Community Relations Advisory Council urged the American Jewish community not to "overwhelm itself with fears" of an erosion of American public support for Israel.

NEW YORK -- The National Jewish Community Relations Advisory Council rejected a request for membership from the Jewish Defense League.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Palestinian Arab terrorists are being trained at air bases in the People's Republic of China as pilots of fighter planes and helicopters, according to reliable sources here.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Dr. Judah J. Shapiro, president of the Labor Zionist Alliance, has warned that the United States cannot hope for the friendly relationship it seeks with Israel if the U.S. appears to be dictating terms to the Jewish State.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Sen Russell B. Long (D. La) in a Baton Rouge interview urged support for President Ford and Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger and said Israel's politicians "ought to tell the facts of life" to people of Israel and cooperate with Kissinger.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Council of Jewish Welfare Federations and Welfare Funds has announced plans to open an office in Washington.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A National Religious Party Knesset member, Zevulun Hammer, has introduced a bill to provide free education in Israel for all Jewish youths in the diaspora between the ages of 14 and 25.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- A public hearing will be held next month by the National News Council on a complaint by the American Jewish Congress charging CBS News with inaccuracy and distortion in a segment of the "60 Minutes" program dealing with Syria's relationship to Israel.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- In a surprise action, the Jewish Agency Assembly adopted a resolution supporting charter flights to and from Israel.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Jewish National Fund, traditionally a tree-planting organization, expects to make \$1.89 million this year by thinning forests.

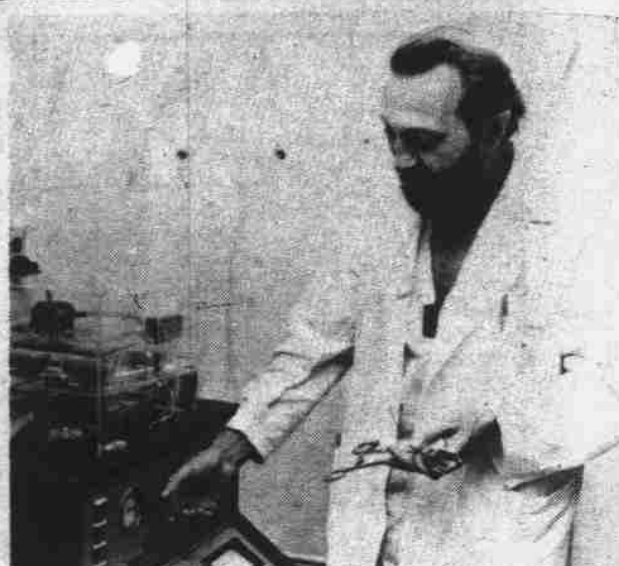
UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The United Nations Preparatory Conference on Human Settlement (Habitat) adopted a recommendation in Teheran to exclude Israel from its forthcoming conference in Vancouver, British Columbia, because of Israel's alleged responsibility for the "involuntary migration of two million Palestinian Arabs and for the destruction of thousands (sic) of their homes and villages."

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Chief Rabbi Moses Rosen of Rumania ended a two-day visit to Israel expressing hope that every Jew in Rumania who wishes to emigrate to Israel will receive an exit visa.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Four terrorists were killed and one Israeli soldier wounded in a clash near the Lebanese border after an Israeli patrol spotted a break in the security fence and surprised the terrorists.

TEL AVIV -- American and Russian immigrants joined to enjoy each other's traditional music and song, and discuss mutual challenges in absorption into Israel society in the first program of ethnic folklore evenings sponsored by the ZOA House in Tel Aviv.
