While many commentators believe that Prime Minister Rabin's visit has produced a welcome detente in U.S.-Israel relations and improved prospects for a second-stage Egyptian-Israeli agreement, Columnists Evans and Novak have resumed their attack on Israel (June 18), charg-ing that Rabin's "studied intransigence dismayed American officials" and has "at least tem-

American officials" and has "at least temporarily hardened the deadlock that aborted Kissinger's last mediation effort in March."

They offer flimsy evidence. Describing a White House dinner, they quote Rep. William Broomfield (R-Mich.), who expressed pessimism about the prospects of new interim negotiations. But Broomfield denied that he had put the blame on Israel. He told this writer that a solution lies indirect talks between the parties. a solution lies in direct talks between the parties,

Rep. Benjamin Rosenthal (D-N,Y;), who sat beside Broomfield, described the columnists' report as "absurd...it did not sound like the same meeting." Israel diplomats concurred. Evans and Novak point out that Rabin avoided mentioning Secretary Kissinger when he toasted President Ford at the White 'House

toasted President Ford at the White 'House dinner, But Rabin was highly complimentary to Kissinger when he toasted the Secretary of State at a subsequent embassy dinner, and Kissinger, in a warm reply, declared that "we could not live with ourselves if we had impaired the well-being and security of impaired the well-being and security of Israel.

Norman F. Dacey has viciously impugned the integrity of leading American senators in full-page advertisements charging that they support Israel because they receive honoraria for speeches delivered before Jewish organizations.

It insults the intelligence of the American people to assert that any of the 13 senators villified by Dacey would vote against their or America's best interests in exchange for modest speaking fees.

Another bigoted soloist is back.

Benjamin H. Friedman -- who founded the "League for Peace with Justice in Palestine" and who published full-page advertisements dur-ing the 1947 UN debate -- has a two-page advertisement in the Borger News Herald (Texas) in which he again insists that today's Jews in Israel are not really descendants of the original inhabitants, but are children of the Khazars, a Russian tribe which converted to Judaism in the eighth century.
Friedman's ad is headlined: "Why and How

Zionists Blackmail Congress -- How and Why Congress Committed Treason."


