## COMPANIES THAT ACCEDE TO ARAB PRESSURE VS JEWS BREAK N.Y. LAW

### RABIN: ISRAEL MUST DETERMINE RISKS

BONN (WNS) -- Premier Yitzhak Rabin, in an historic visit to West Germany, declared that because Israel must defend itself alone, "we have the elementary right to decide for ourselves what we can risk and what we dare not risk as

we work to achieve peace with our neighbors."

His remarks, at a dinner given in his honor by Chancellor Helmut Schmidt, were seen partly in response to West Germany's urging that Israel be more flexible in the current Mideast negotiations. He said that Western Europe's greatest contribution toward peace would be to encourage those directly involved to negotiate a settlement without outside interference.

Rabin is the first Israeli Prime Minister to visit West Germany in an official capacity. He arrived first in West Berlin and began his visit with a trip to the site of the former Bergen-Belsen concentration camp.

Before leaving Israel, he said: I am aware of the horrible tragedy which overtook our Jewish people, a tragedy for which Nazi Germany was responsible. Yet, I am aware that bridges have to be bridged over the past so that the future would be brighter."

NEW YORK -- Any company, bank, or educational institution in New York State that might accede to Arab pressures for discrimination against Jews in return for Arab investments would be guilty of violating not only the civil rights law, but a variety of other state laws as well, according to a survey of New York State laws just completed for the American Jewish Committee.

The intensive survey, prepared by the law firm of Rosenman Colin Kaye Petschek Freund and Emil, under the supervision of Gerald Walpin, was sent to Governor Carey by Bertram H. Gold, AJC's Executive Vice President.

In an accompanying letter to the Governor, Mr. Gold expressed the hope that "this survey may prove useful as a legal foundation for counteracting such (Arab boycott) activities as are found to exist in New York and are ascertained to be in violation of the laws."

"While hard evidence may be difficult to adduce because of the covert nature of Arab boycott activities," he stated, "there is no question that the boycott has been operational in New York and inevitably has had an adverse effect on trade and commerce in this state."

AJC's regional offices throughout the country will be encouraged to conduct similar state surveys in their jurisdictions, so that it will be possible to counteract Arab anti-Semitism wherever it may appear, Mr. Gold explained.

The basic thrust of the New York State survey was to determine what legal actions might be available in the event that a company, bank or other institution, eager to attract Arab money, should refuse to hire or do business with Jews or with anyone hiring or doing business with Jews, or to do business with Israel

### Tourist Touriss

We caution you not to leave any valuables in your room. The ripoffs are gathering momentum and even if the culprit is caught it means headaches and sometimes the partial return of your property.

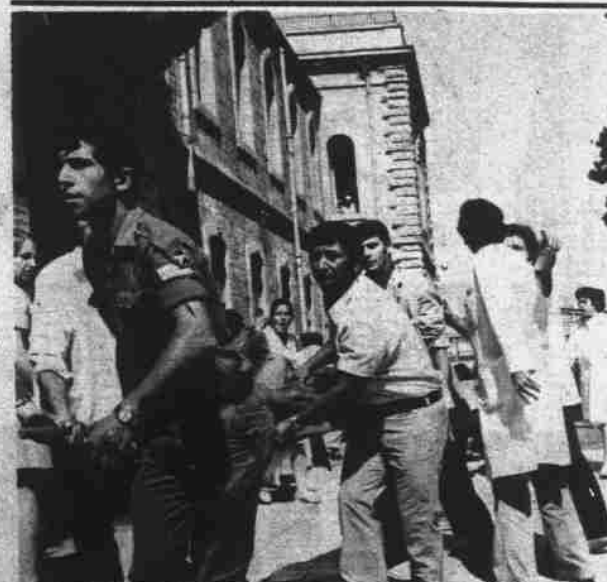
If you are bent on gambling don't drink too much while watching a show. The juices are regular and consecutive at the tables. Just because they are free is no reason to over-indulge. After all, you are gambling with your own money (we hope) and therefore you should have full and complete control of your reasoning capacities at all times.

When gambling, have some idea of the operation. It is so sad to watch people who haven't the faintest, throwing away their money without any chance whatsoever of winning. Before you start to play read even the simple rules of the game.

In craps, for instance, when you bet the pass line, be sure to take the full odds on the number. It is the only percentage free wager in all of the gambling business. If you do not take advantage of this one opportunity, you are doing yourself and your bankroll a disservice. Watch for yourself and note at any given craps game, how many do not avail themselves of this one and only benefit in all of legalized gambling.

At 21, if you do not separate aces or fail to double down with ten or eleven (when dealer has less than a face card) your mother should not let you out of the house alone. If you risk
