

COMANCHEROS INDIAN SHOW AT FRONTIER

During the early 1800s, these gypsy-like people, supposedly descended from the first Mexican and Anglo buffalo hunters, living among the pueblos of New Mexico and hunting on the Llano Estacado or Staked Plains, had become deeply implanted among the Comanche, Kiowa, Lipan and Jicarilla Apache. They were known as Comancheros - those to do with the Comanches. From hunting, they became traders, nomadic was their way of life. They traded for Buffalo hides, basketry, pottery, jewelry, gold, silver, horses and at times prisoners who had been captured in Mexico and on the West Texas border. In return they furnished guns, powder, lead, whiskey, beads, knives, hatchets, metal arrowheads, blankets of German manufacture, and, of course, candy for the children and gay colored cloth for the women. In the beginning the Comancheros made their forays out upon the Staked Plains with no rendezvous in mind,

they trusted to accidental encounters with wandering bands. Later, they set-up rendezvous where the Indians with their plunder and they with their commodities could barter and trade. These gatherings became a way or tradition, a time to relax and enjoy the company of old friends. Today, traders throughout the West, from stores and shops in the cities, from trading posts along the highways, from outlying Indian reservations, the word has spread of the "gathering."
