JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Despite the Egyptian threat not to renew the mandate for the United Nations Emergency Force (UNEF) in the Sinai, Israel is pursuing negotiations with Egypt as if there were no threat.

Israeli sources said that Premier Yitzhak Rabin's government is waiting to hear Egyptian President Anwar Sadat's reaction to Israel's latest proposal. They were given to Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger by Israel Ambassador Simcha Dinitz in Washington. Hermann Ellts, the U.S. Ambassador to Egypt, was then sent to Cairo to present the Israeli proposals. At the same time both Egypt and Israel are taking military measures to prepare for the eventuality that the UNEF troops are removed from the buffer between Israeli and Egyptian forces.

Meanwhile at the United Nations, members of the Security Council were conducting private consultations in an effort to reach a formula that will extend the UNEF mandate. Diplomatic sources at the UN said the problem is the Council does not know what Egypt wants. Egyptian Ambassador Abdel Meguid has been quoted as saying that Egypt would like a resolution calling for Israeli withdrawal from all territories occupied since the Six Day War of 1967. But State Department spokesman Robert Anderson has emphasized that the U.S. is against any changes in the Security Council resolutions adopted after the Six Day War and the 1973 Yom Kippur War. "It is my very clear understanding that we continue to stand behind (Continued on Page 3)

An Oil Man? Hell no, brothers.

I make my money betting on horse races
at the "Santa Anita Race Book" on the Strip —
Las Vegas, Nevada

There were so many compliments on last week's column, we decided on a continuation. Our advice to tourists, so far, were strictly basics in the games of chance. Anyone who has gambled even a little would know them as matters of course. Let's add a few more fundamentals before we dig a little deeper.

Sammy Cohen complained that we never mentioned the age-old sport of horse racing. We asked Sammy what advice we could give to followers of the turf. Sammy said tell them to save their money. Sammy owns the Santa Anita Race Book, and is the kindest, and one of the finest gentlemen we have ever met.

If you must bet on horses, stay away from favorites in two year old races early in the year. They make a better bet after June. Look out for too much weight in a distance race and lean towards mudders on a dry turf course.

In craps, the same principle of full odds on the pass line goes for any come bet numbers. The only system we know of, that has any merit, is the one using the law against probabilities. Explained simply, it means, forin-
