WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Rep. Morris K. Udall (D. ARIZ.) has called the administra-tion's proposed \$350 million arms sale to Jordan "a definite threat to the balance of power in the Middle East."

WARWICK, N. Y. -- During the past two-and-one-half months, no exit visas have been granted to Soviet Jews in Moscow and there appears to be no movement, according to Soviet Jewish activist Leila Kornfeld, over a tele-phone hook-up July 17 between the UAHC's summer camp in Warwick, N. Y. and Moscow.

NEW YORK -- A new program to train girls studying in seminaries as medical assistants was announced by the Vocational Education Division of Project COPE, the manpower divi-sion of Agudath Israel of America.

NEW YORK (WUP) -- Senator Henry M. Jackson, in a campaign letter sent to millions of Americans, has declared that "a strong larael is vital to American foreign policy in the Mideast."

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Yitzhak Rabin returned to Israel after meeting with, Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger in Bonn and received from his Cabinet approval to continue the process of seeking "clarification" an interim agreement with Egypt by contracts with Washington.

LONDON (WNS) -- Measures to block Arab boycott targets were included in the discussions leading to the recently signed pact between Israel and the European Common Market countries.
