

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Rep. Morris K. Udall (D. ARIZ.) has called the administration's proposed \$350 million arms sale to Jordan "a definite threat to the balance of power in the Middle East."

WARWICK, N. Y. -- During the past two-and-one-half months, no exit visas have been granted to Soviet Jews in Moscow and there appears to be no movement, according to Soviet Jewish activist Leila Kornfeld, over a telephone hook-up July 17 between the UAHC's summer camp in Warwick, N. Y., and Moscow.

NEW YORK -- A new program to train girls studying in seminaries as medical assistants was announced by the Vocational Education Division of Project COPE, the manpower division of Agudath Israel of America.

NEW YORK -- Chaplain (Colonel) Joseph B. Messing has been appointed the West Coast representative of JWB's Commission on Jewish Chaplaincy.

NEW YORK -- "The Jewish Book in America: A Bicentennial Celebration" is the theme of the forthcoming Jewish Book Month, which the Jewish Book Council of JWB has announced will be observed from October 31 to November 28.

NEW YORK -- United States support of Israel has been a positive factor in strengthening our detente with the Soviet Union, and has not significantly lessened our relations with the Arab world, according to an analysis of the U.S. stake in the Middle East just published by the American Jewish Committee. WASHINGTON -- The American Jewish Congress urged President Ford to end the "odious practice" of discrimination against Jewish Army personnel in assignments to Saudi Arabia and other Arab countries as revealed in a report of the General Officers' Steering Committee on Equal Opportunity.

NEW YORK -- Mrs. Faye Schenk, President of the American Zionist Federation, voiced strong opposition to the proposed American sale of anti-aircraft missile systems to Jordan.

WASHINGTON -- The American Jewish Congress called for a Federal gun control law banning "the manufacture, importation, sale and ownership of all types of handguns and handgun ammunition" except for law enforcement officers.

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- Dr. Andrew W. Cordier, 74, the man who read out the thirty-three decisive votes on 29 November 1947 affirming Israeli statehood, died Friday night, July 11.

NEW YORK (WUP) -- Senator Henry M. Jackson, in a campaign letter sent to millions of Americans, has declared that "a strong Israel is vital to American foreign policy in the Mideast."

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Yitzhak Rabin returned to Israel after meeting with Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger in Bonn and received from his Cabinet approval to continue the process of seeking "clarification" on an interim agreement with Egypt by contracts with Washington.

LONDON (WNS) -- Measures to block Arab boycott targets were included in the discussions leading to the recently signed pact between Israel and the European Common Market countries.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The adoption by the New York State Legislature of a bill prohibiting "boycott or blacklist" directed against individuals or corporations residing or doing business in the state was hailed by the American Jewish Congress.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Jewish National Fund has begun work on its \$6 million project to develop the American Bicentennial Park on the western ridges of the Judean Mountains.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- An alert border police-women captured two terrorists at gunpoint at Ben Gurion Airport averting a major disaster in the crowded airport, and an Israeli army patrol killed three Arab terrorists who were planning to capture hostages in a clash near Merullah.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- There must be no changes to the Jackson-Vanik amendment to the Trade act without an improvement in the Soviet Union's restrictive emigration policy, the National Conference on Soviet Jewry and the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations said in a joint statement.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The Palestine Liberation Organization is listed, for the first time, in the United Nations "Blue Book" of permanent missions to the UN for 1975.

PARIS (WNS) -- The Ministry of Interior has reported that the death list of a wanted terrorist known as "Carlos" included the name of Israel's Ambassador to France, Asher Ben Natan. The list also included prominent personalities in the press, theater, banking and sports.
