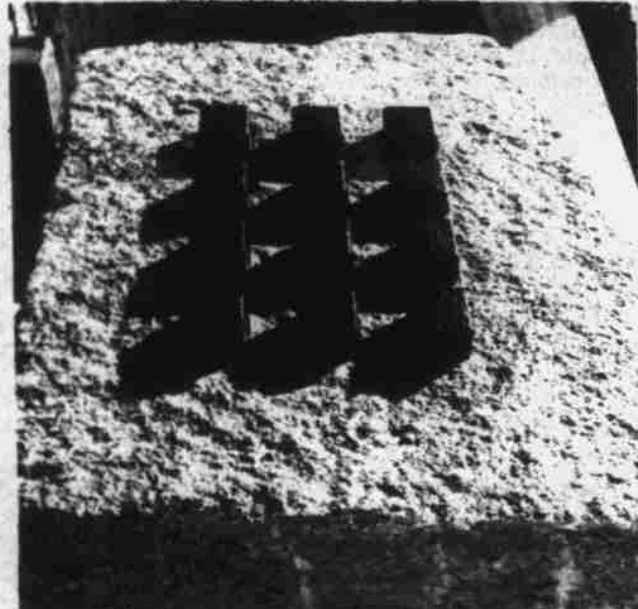

That's how Sheriff Lamb feels, and we respect him for it. He unknowingly, or unwittingly sanctioned a wrong date (by a few months) for the sake of his child's welfare. Hooray for him. When called on it he was all man. He admitted his mistake, corrected it and said he was sorry. We prefer Lamb's philosophy over Alan King's, who turned his son into the authorities on a drug offense.

Lamb is a great sheriff, and he is entitled to one misfraction in a lifetime. That was the grand jury's disposition -- total exoneration. We agree, and that's that.

Some time ago, Ralph bought a half interest in a race horse, "Huntington Lady." We told him we hope it is a good one, because the bad ones eat just as much. The horse is a front runner and did win a couple of races. Then, what happened to Ralph, shouldn't happen to a man who can't add being tagged by I.R.S.

First, the horse bled. It was in a race that should have been a walkover. The next race, the horse, out in front by three, bolted. The next time out, leading by a length and a half in the stretch, the horse stopped cold.

So Ralph, instead of shooting the nag, sold his interest. The first start, last week at Del Mar, Huntington Lady finished third, and paid \$5.20. The "Lady" had regained her form, but it will be a while before Ralph stops muttering to himself.

Back in May the congregation acquired a new president, Harold Berry.

In his inaugural address, Mr. Berry toyed with the question, "Why should anyone want the job?" The question is especially poignant since Shaary Zedek, large though it is, elegant though it is, is, like other institutions, hurting financially.

Mr. Berry answered his own query by explaining that his father had once been lay head of the synagogue and his father's imprint on him was strong. Besides a grandfather of his had been president of a shul in Liverpool, England, and he had a feeling of noblesse oblige to follow in the footsteps of that ancestor, who had strongly influenced him.

Mr. Berry then went on to say that he found Judaism "increasingly relevant to the world." He sensed among American Jews "a yearning for an encounter with Jewish tradition." In Israel, he met a guide who told him that he had been "Judaized" by a visit to the U.S. where he discovered that the synagogue is "the glue that holds our people together."

Waxing exquisitely philosophical, Mr. Berry told his audience that the cultivation of the mind without the simultaneous sensitization of the heart can be calamitous. In South America one sees the consequences of the navigational skill of ancient Spaniards, who had "courage, intellect and curiosity." And what did these heartless Spaniards do? They committed genocide on the denizens of that continent, even as they booted the Jews out of their country in 1492.

Concludes President Berry: "No wonder the psalmist asks for a heart of wisdom, not a head of wisdom."

Every synagogue should have a president as perspicacious and as brilliant as Harold Berry!

Israel not So, Africa

The efforts of the Arab countries to bracket Israel and South Africa as international outlaws is one of the more scurrilous examples of anti-Zionist propaganda. The Arabs and their allies are attempting to use the expulsion of South Africa from the General Assembly of the United Nations last year as a precedent for their attempt to expel Israel when the Assembly opens in September.

There is no justification whatsoever for linking Israel with South Africa. Israel is a democratic state based on the principles of equality, justice and freedom. The idea of apartheid as practiced in South Africa is repugnant to Israel as it is to Judaism.

Although there are certain security restrictions, Israeli Arabs, both Moslems and Christians, enjoy conditions unprecedented in any other nation in a state of semi war. Israeli Arabs vote for and serve in the Knesset and the government. Needless to say Jews in Israel represent all the racial hues. Israel has always sought good relations and cooperation with the Black African countries until these countries, under Arab pressure, rejected Israeli friendship. Regardless, Africans continue to come to Israel for training and education.

In fact, it is the Arabs who are carrying out a policy of racism in their fight against Israel. The Arab states today are the chief sources of anti-Semitic propaganda in the world. The late King Faisal of Saudi Arabia enjoyed nothing more than handing out anti-Jewish propaganda, including the long-discredited "Protocols of the Elders of Zion" to visitors including the Jewish newsmen who accompanied Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger to Saudi Arabia.

Should the Arabs even attempt to expel Israel from the General Assembly it could wreck the UN itself. It will certainly endanger attempts to bring peace into the Middle East and perhaps the rest of the world as well.

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- Delayed for seven long hours because of Egyptian insistence on the change of a single word in the draft, the Security Council last week - Thursday, July 24, the very day the UNEF mandate expired --

adopted another of its many one-sided anti-Israel resolutions which completely ignored any reference to Israel's communications respecting the renewal of UNEF.

The Egyptian Ambassador Abdel Meguid had made such ado about Cairo's demand for a change of a single word, "satisfaction," -- he asked for "appreciation" -- in paragraph three of the draft which reads:

"Bearing in mind the appeal addressed by the President of the Security Council to the Government of the Arab Republic of Egypt on 21 July 1975 and expressing satisfaction with the reply of the Government of the Republic of Egypt thereto."

However, Washington's new Ambassador to the UN, Daniel P. Moynihan, objected to this 'semantic' change and he got the Council to agree to keep the word "satisfaction." Still not content, Meguid requested another change, the use of the word "for" instead of "with" after "satisfaction." Recognizing that such a minor change did not mean anything basic, the Council agreed so as to get moving with the resolution.

Of course, the fact that the Council did express "satisfaction for" the Egyptian reply meant, in a sense, "approval" of the many anti-Israel references in that letter.

Incensed over this one-sided resolution, Ambassador Jacob Doron, speaking on behalf of Israel, strongly criticized the Council. He said that the draft adopted chose to ignore completely the Israeli communications on UNEF's renewal. He termed the latest Council action "as blatant an example of deliberate one-sidedness" as could be imagined.

"In view of this obvious and crass one-sidedness of the text, which deliberately distorts the facts and ignores the constructive attitude of Israel," he declared, "I have been instructed to voice the strongest protest of my Government against the draft resolution."

Doron went on to complain that an international organ, such as the Security Council, must not accept dictates by means of unilateral pronouncements, the object of which was to create tension in the area. One must not forget, he stated, that it was Egypt which, ever since the establishment of Israel, had systematically committed breaches of international law. It had proclaimed a blockade against Israel and engaged in belligerent and aggressive actions contrary to its international obligations and the UN Charter.

Let's now see in what direction Mr. Kissinger will go in bringing about the next step in the Sinai.
