

**JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS**

**LOS ANGELES:** Rabbi Stuart Kelman will join Regional Staff as the Consultant to the Department of Youth Activities of United Synagogue of America.

**NEW YORK:** Two of the nation's leading Black newspapers were critical this week of Arab proposals to expel Israel from the UN General Assembly, the American Jewish Congress reported.

**NEW YORK:** Two American nurses who have taken leave to help fill the nursing shortage at the Haddassah-Hebrew University Medical Center in Jerusalem, are: Miriam Frances Beckerman, Beth Israel Hospital, a resident of New Hyde Park, New York, and Judy Wong, Mount Sinai Hospital, of Manhattan.

**NEW YORK --** A group of professional personnel from Jewish Community Centers and camps across the United States will participate in a Professional Workers Seminar in Israel to be conducted September 8-29, 1975 by JWB with the cooperation of the American Zionist Youth Foundation, and the Youth and Hechalutz Department of the World Zionist Organization.

**JERUSALEM:** The role of the Joint Distribution Committee in creating and supporting programs for the care of Israel's aged was highlighted at the 10th International Gerontological Congress held in Jerusalem late in June. One of the largest international conventions ever held in Israel, it had 1,800 overseas participants from some thirty countries around the world.

**TRENTON, N.J. (WNS)--**State-chartered financial institutions in New Jersey have been warned by the state banking commissioner that they must refuse offers of large deposits or loans if they are conditioned upon excluding Jews from boards of directors or as holders of large amounts of stock.

**JERUSALEM (WNS) --** The Israel government will compensate Jews who were imprisoned in Communist or Arab countries for Zionist activities and sustained physical or mental damages.

**NEW YORK,** A group of former Soviet Jews now living in Israel has written an open letter to U. S. President Gerald Ford and to Soviet Communist Party Secretary Leonid Brezhnev on behalf of a Soviet Jewish couple, Aba Stolyar and Gita Razovskaya, who had exit visas to Israel and had boarded the Moscow-Vienna plane on June 19, 1975 when Soviet authorities confiscated their visas and forcibly turned them back, claiming that their "had been a mistake."

**UNITED NATIONS (WNS) --** The United Nations Committee on Conferences has decided to hold the fifth Congress on Crime and Treatment of Offenders in Geneva despite the objections of Canada which wanted the conference postponed.

**NEW YORK --** The American Association for Jewish Education, 114 Fifth Ave., N.Y.C. 10011, announced publication of "To Everything There is a Time," a comprehensive teacher's resource book dealing with the individualization and "opening up" of instruction in Jewish schools.

**US SEVERE IF ISRAEL OUSTED FROM UN**

WASHINGTON- (WNS) -- "The U.S. will take definite and severe action" if the United Nations General Assembly expels or suspends Israel, Sec'y of State Henry A. Kissinger warned at a press conference in Helsinki, Finland, in Vienna, UN Sec'y General Kurt Waldheim also warned that the expulsion of Israel would create a serious crisis for the UN, especially since

the U. S. and other countries have threatened to take counter-measures.

Meanwhile in Washington, a resolution urging the U. S. to withdraw from the General Assembly if Israel is expelled is being prepared for introduction in the House of Representatives.

In Israel, Foreign Minister Yigal Allon warned that if Israel was expelled from the General Assembly it would mean the end of the UN's role in the Middle East peace negotiations, including the Geneva conference.

Several nations have joined the United States in opposing Israel's expulsion. Marshal Tito of Yugoslavia and Chancellor Helmut Schmidt of West Germany in a meeting in Helsinki agreed that if Israel were to be expelled it would mean the end of the world organization. Australian government leaders told Rabbi Arthur Hertzberg, president of the American Jewish Congress, that Australia will oppose any expulsion move. The Swedish & Norwegian governments have announced they would vote against expulsion.
