One Billion Dollars

Everyone knows that a billion dollars is

a whole lot of money.

Just in case some do not realize just how much it is, a billion is a thousand million. That is the record amount taken in gambling last year in the State of Nevada. To be exact, the figure was \$1,060,000,000,00. That is to revenue before taxes and business expenses are deducted.

Each quarter of every year, since gambling was legalized in the early 30's, the gambling take for the state has increased. It never decreased. But topping the billion mark for the first time is indication that the economy Nevada defies inflation, depression and

of Nevada defies inflation, depression and unemployment.

Every area of the state showed a rise, with Clark County (Las Vegas) compiling the largest boost, \$729,900,000, up 14.5 percent over last year. The Gaming Control Board attributed the hike to the hundreds and hundreds of added rooms built in the area during 1974-75.

Profits were not as great as in previous years, because expenses have increased considerably, but the casino operators are not complaining. The only ones, who seem disturbed are those little old ladies at the nickel slots, who mumble how tight the machines are over past years.

However, lesser pay-offs are no deterrent to the slot addict's "only game in town."

They are more determined than ever to beat those mechanical monsters. Let's not kid ourselves. There are just as many sophisticated gamblers, as frail women, pulling the bondless these days. (We like it because you handles these days. (We like it because you do not have to think, or guess or choose, All you do is insert your coin, spin the wheels and hope.)

Probably the increase in gaming revenue, especially on the Strip, may be due to the two dollar minimum bets at the crap tables and 21, and the fifty cents only chips at roulette. Those multiple slots have also

added to the grand total pot.

That's why we favor the El Cortez where the single-coin machines pay off at the rate of 2000 to one for the hig jackpots. You can win \$100 for a nickel, \$200 for a dime, \$500 for a quarter, \$1000 for a half and \$2000 for a cartwheel. And they pay off with a smile.

The slot story we get the biggest kick out of was the man who was playing for hours without a single pay off. He turned to a man standing next to him and said: "If they drdp.
