TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel launched three raids on terrorists' bases in Southern Lebanon following an attempt by a terrorist group to infiltrate into Israel in which one Israeli soldier and a terrorist were killed.

HOUSTON (WNS)---In a test of whether the Soviet Union intends to carry out the Helsinki declaration calling for the "free flow of peoples, ideas and information" the B'nai B'rith's Board of Governors voted here to send an official delegation to the USSR to meet with both Jewish activists and Soviet officials.

NEW YORK (WNS)---Jewish municipal employees and teachers who have been laid off in New York City's economy drive are being sought by aliya representatives for emigration to 'srael where there is a man power shortage in some fields.

HAIFA--The Joseph and Arlene Taub Institute of Biological Research has been established at the Mount Carmel campus of the Technion--Israel Institute of Technology.

JERUSALEM--B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations commemorates its 25th anniversary in Israel Sunday, Aug. 17, with the opening of a \$1-million Beit Hillel (Hillel House) on the Mount Scopus campus of the Hebrew University.

NEW YORK! The American Jewish Congress hailed the signing of a new state law---the first in the nation--prohibiting "boycott or blacklist" directed against individuals or corporations residing or doing business in New York State,

NEW YORK (WNS)--The United Jewish Appeal's Young Leadership "Koach" Mission to Israel, scheduled for November by 1,000 will demonstrate the understanding between young leaders in Israel and the United States, Premier Yitzhak Rabin said.


TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Ben Gurion Airport now has a special new terminal to handle arriving immigrants.

WASHINGTON (WNS)--Japan supports the United States initiative in the Middle East, Japanese Prime Minister Takeo Miki told the National Press Club.

JERUSALEM (WNS)—A new arrangement for the Tomb of the Patriarchs in Hebron which provides for Moslem and Jewish prayers on the basis of space rather than time has been approved by the Cabinet, but the Moslem Supreme Council, which met in Jerusalem, rejected it. The large "Isaac and Rebecca" hall will be reserved for Moslem prayers all day and that the smaller "Abraham and Sarah" and "Jacob and Leah" halls will serve for Jewish prayers which presently are limited to seven hours a day. In addition, Fridaya will be reserved for Moslem worshippers.
