N.Y. TIMES SEES SINAI SHOWDOWN

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- Reporting from Jerusalem, New York Times writer Henry Kamm sees a real showdown on Sinai in the current Kissinger mediation efforts.

"No matter how

strongly Premier Yitzhak Rabin's Government protests that Secretary of State Kissinger's arrival does not mean that an interim agreement with Egypt on Sinai is a foregone conclusion," Kamm states, "official circles take it for granted that it is, 'Israel,' he notes, 'simply cannot afford to let Mr. Kissinger return home empty-handed once more, as happened in March... The crisis in Israel's relations with the U.S., her indispensable ally, that followed that setback was traumatic. Mr. Rabin is assumed to be convinced that he cannot afford to risk saddling the United States with another failure in its role as peace-maker.'"
