

KISSINGER BACK FOR 2ND STAGE SHUTTLE

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger arrived in Israel to begin attempts to con-

clude a second-stage agreement between Israel and Egypt in the Sinai amidst the tightest security pre-

cautions in Israeli history.

As protests by groups opposed to the agreement increased in intensity, Ben Gurion Airport was closed off for Kissinger's arrival and the streets surrounding the King David Hotel where the Kissinger entourage is staying and the homes of Premier Yitzhak Rabin and Foreign Minister Yigal Allon were barred to the public. Anti-Kissinger signs were daubed all along the road leading to Jerusalem. One police official said he could not recall such deep hatred for one individual being expressed by Israelis as in the present demonstrations against Kissinger.

The protests which had increased during the days prior to the American official's arrival were aimed at forcing Israel to reject the proposed agreement. Allon urged Israelis to direct their criticism at the Israeli government not Kissinger, Israeli Ambassador Simcha Dinitz who arrived from Washington before Kissinger denounced all efforts to depict Israel as a

nations which yields to dictates. He said Israel was ready to reach an agreement "but not at any price. We know to say no but we should not make the no an ideology."

Upon his arrival, Kissinger said it "should be possible to bring to a close this phase of diplomacy in the Middle East with

positive results serving the interests of both sides and the cause of peace in the area." He added that: "The gap... has been substantially narrowed by concessions on both sides."

At Andrews Air Force Base before leaving for Israel Kissinger said that he was confident Israel's request for new U.S. weapons would be worked out.

Prior to Kissinger's arrival many elements of the proposed agreement had been reported here. Yitzhak Navon, chairman of the Knesset Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee, said on Israeli television that one clause is that Israel and Egypt


will give the U.S. an assurance that both of them will be "committed to refrain from the use or threat of force and resolve their differences through negotiations and other peaceful means." Navon said that both sides agreed that the mandate for the United Nations Emergency Force in Sinai will be renewed for three years and that they cannot be removed without the consent of both sides.

The Labor MK also said that the U.S. would provide Israel with sophisticated arms and an alternative oil supply to compensate for the return of Abu Rodeis oilfields to Egypt.


