NO COMMITMENT TO SUPPLY ISRAEL WITH LONG RANGE PERSHING MISSILES

TALKS WITH SYRIA PREMATURE

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Cabinet "has not decided to hold interim talks with Syria and has not authorized anyone to promise that such talks will be held," Foreign Minister Yigal Allon told the Knesset.

But in the United States, Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger said that the U.S. "will seriously encourage a negotiation between Syria and Israel."

Allon's statement was made as the Knesset rejected by a 60-25 vote a Likud motion to hold a debate on Syria. Allon said the issue of negotiations on the Golan Heights was an "unlaid egg" and it was therefore premature to begin arguments in Israel "over negotiations which have not yet been decided upon." He stressed that the Israeli position has been that it favors

"negotiations without preconditions with each Arab state, including Syria, for full peace agreements." He said that "If the agreement with Egypt, and the method and spirit of the implementation create suitable conditions for further progress with any Arab country, we will not miss any such opportunity..."

In New York, visiting Defense Minister Shimon Peres said that the only movement in the Mideast for the next six months will be the implementation of the Israeli-Egyptian accord on the Sinai. This was seen as an indication that talks with Syria are not in the offing soon. But Kissinger, addressing the Cincinnati Chamber of Commerce, said the U.S. will encourage Israeli-Syrian talks because "there can be no stagnation, for the (Mideast) area remains tense and volatile." He said no date was set for the talks because the American position is that they can not begin until both countries were ready and neither Syria nor Israel has agreed yet on the nature of the talks.

Kissinger said the U.S. did not help bring about the Israeli-Egyptian accord "in order to put an end to the process of peace but to give it new impetus."

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The United States will supply Israel with "various substantial amounts of military hardware," but there is no U.S. commitment to provide Israel with long-range "Pershing" ground-to-ground missiles or the new, highly sophisticated F-16 fighter planes, President Ford told an impromptu White House press conference.

Ford's comments came in response to press reports that the U.S. commitments to provide Israel with the F-16's which are not expected to go into production until 1978 and the "Pershings" are part of the Israeli-Egyptian Sinai accord. The missiles with a 460-mile (Continued on Page 3)
