CANNON URGES LEGAL GAMBLING INVESTMENTS

Sen. Howard Cannon urged the nation's financial investors to take a new look at legal gaming as a dynamic investment in a new industry "which has only begun to take off."

The senator told

told senator businessmen and finanalysts ancial Palace the Caesar's financial annual conference that gaming Nevada's is gaining industry increasing recognition and respect by the Federal government and the long outlook legalized gambling

Cannon asked.

Cannon is a member of the Commission to Review the National Policy toward Gambling, which was created by Congress in 1972.

He pointed out that no other industry in America is as stringently controlled and as closely scrutinized by government.

government,

"The Federal government is moving more and more toward the acceptance of gambling as an irrepressable human activity and of the legalized gaming industry as a respectable enterprise," Cannon said,

He added "in no other industry is the investor subjected to as close a personal and financial scrutiny as that required by the State's

Gaming Control
Board and the industry
itself."

The State's gaming industry earned \$1,32 billion last year, and paid state taxes of \$82,539,000 thus providing 47 percent of the total revenues collected in the Nevada State general fund in 1974.

"I have witnessed vast improvement in the ability to convince Congress and the executive department to be fair with regard to its relations to problems of legalized gaming," Cannon reported.

The senator pointed to Congressional approval of his measure to 80 percent of the machine excise slot tax to the state of this Under origin. amount, Nevada's treasury receives more than \$10 mil-lion a year, Earlier this year, Cannon was able to secure the the 10 reduction of tax excise percent on sporting contests to two "Hopefully, percent. it will be before very reduced long to zero percent,"Even Cannon said. if casino

gambling became legalized in other Nevada's states, future is safe," he said. "With its 45year head start, with its multi-billion dolplant, skilled lar staff and special know how in every aspect of tourism, this unique industry can Nevada have no other serious competitor.
