U.S. AND RUSSIA AGREE FOR MULTI-LATERAL MEETING ON MIDEAST

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- CONGRESS IS EXPECTED TO TAKE AT LEAST ANOTHER WEEK BEFORE IT COMES UP WITH A JOINT HOUSE-SENATE RESOLUTION ON THE ISRAELI-EGYPTIAN AGREEMENT.

ALLON CONFAB WITH GROMYKO

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Israeli Foreign Minister Yigal Allon and Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko discussed all aspects of the Middle East situation at a three-hour meeting at the Soviet Mission to the United Nations.

The meeting which was revealed by an Israeli spokesman took place at Allon's initiative and had been kept a closely guarded secret after it was arranged. According to the Israeli spokesman, Chaim Herzog, Israel's Ambassador to the UN, approached the Soviet Mission and suggested that since both Allon and Gromyko are in New York for the 30th UN General Assembly they should meet.

This was the first pre-arranged meeting between high-ranking Israeli and Soviet officials since the USSR broke diplomatic relations with Israel following the 1967 Six-Day-War. There had been unofficial reports of secret and chance meetings between Israeli and Soviet diplomats in Washington and Europe during the past three years.

ANTI-ISRAEL ISLAMIC SESSION AT U.N.

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- The first Islamic conference outside a Moslem

country opened here at UN headquarters on Tuesday, September 30.

Some forty foreign ministers of Islamic states met in an unusual 'religious' session with one single aim in view: to attack Israel.

At the previous sixth meeting of the Islamic Conference held at Jedda, Saudi Arabia, it was decided to instruct the 13-nation Jerusalem Committee of the organization with the task of finding ways and means of building up public opinion around the world against what the Moslems regard as Israeli attempts to change the character of Jerusalem. For this purpose, it was disclosed here, an Islamic bank, with a working capital of \$1 billion, is nearly ready to commence operations.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger has declared that the United States will begin discussions on the reopening of the Geneva conference on the Mideast as well as "explore possibilities for perhaps a more informal multi-lateral meeting to assess conditions and to discuss the future."

His remarks were made to the United Nations General Assembly which opened its 30th annual policy debate. Kissinger's suggestion for a multi-lateral meeting was seen by observers in Washington as a means of bringing the Palestinians, perhaps even the Palestine Liberation Organization into the talks.

In his UN address, Kissinger stressed that the Israel - Egyptian agreement in the Sinai created an opportunity for further progress "but opportunities must be seized or they will disappear." He said the U.S. is "prepared to make a serious effort to encourage negotiations between Syria and Israel." He also noted that
