The famed medical center on Mt. Scopus in Jerusalem will reopen in October. In honor of this occasion, the Las Vegas Chapter of Hadassah is proud to announce a Gold Key Dinner, honoring five local civic leaders, who are instrumental in furthering the welfare of Hadassah. This gala affair will be held at the Dunes Hotel, October 13, no host cocktails at 7 p.m., dinner at 8 p.m.; donation -- purchase of a gold Key, a replica of the Key that hangs over the entrance of the newly rebuilt and expanded hospital.

As redeemers of Mt. Scopus, Book of Builders, these honored guests are Mel Exber, Jack Fishman, Jack Leonard, Ralph Plotkin and Dr. Leon Steinberg. In 1939 Mt. Scopus

hospital was opened by Hadassah to become a famous medical center in the Middle East. The access to this hospital was cut off by Jordan in 1948 and evacuated. For 19 years the hospital lay dormant in an un-

visited no-man's land until Jerusalem was reunited in 1967. Rebuilt and expanded to 3 1/2 its original size, the hospital includes a modern rehabilitation institute, 300 beds, serving 75,000 people of East Jerusalem and the West Bank.

Hadassah maintains the Hadassah - Hebrew University Medical Center at Ein Karem, the largest medical com-

plex for healing, teaching and research in the Middle East. Mt. Scopus is part of this center.

In addition to the Arab population, Mt. Scopus hospital will serve the new immigrant housing developments.

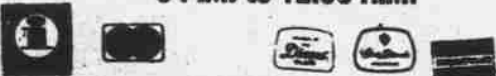
