ALLON TELLS U.N. GEN. ASSEMBLY ISRAEL 'READY, WILLING' FOR PEACE

DAVID SKELTON BAR MITZVAH

to a Kiddush in the Entratter Social Hall immediately after the conclusion of the services.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Israel is "ready and willing" to engage in peace negotiations with all its neighbors and will "favor any mechanism which will advance the process of negotiations between the parties to the (Middle East) conflict," Israeli Foreign Minister Yigal Allon declared in an address to the 30th session of the General Assembly.

Allon, who is also Deputy Premier, announced that Israel is prepared, even before peace is achieved, to consult with its neighbors to end the "senseless competition" of the Mideast arms race and to reach agreement with them to make the Middle East a nuclear-free zone. He affirmed that "the government of Israel is ready and willing to enter in peace talks with Syria without any prior conditions as called for by (Security Council) Resolution 338 at any place and any time" even though Syria has repeatedly said it rejects "the whole concept of a genuine peace treaty with Israel." Allon said the Geneva peace conference could be resumed whenever the parties are ready for it following adequate preparations. Allon said Israel not only supports the Geneva conference but is also prepared to give "most earnest consideration" to Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger's proposal for informal, multi-lateral consultations on the Middle East.

The Israeli Foreign Minister said Israel knows "that genuine peace in the Middle East must include a just and constructive solution for the Palestine Arab problem." However, he said the solution requires a change of attitude in the Arab world since "The Palestine Arab problem should and can be solved in the context of a peace agreement between Israel and Jordan which constitutes the major part of the area of his-

Dear I.E.F.:

We answer you (not the first and probably not the last comment on the subject) because you are honest enough to give your full name and address, and also with an eye to that seven bucks subscription (for one year).

At the very beginning (some 15 years ago) we doubt if anyone admired Hank Greenspun as much as yours truly, Jack Tell. He stood for everything in journalism we believed in. His stands against McCarthy and the McCarron-hotellowners clique. His championship of causes for the people. His constant battle against stuffed shirts and political miscreants. He was our boy.

We refrain from any comment about Greenspun's arms-running to Israel because the information we have is self-serving from him. There are too many vital statistics omitted by Greenspun, and therefore, discounting rumors, we do not have enough information on which to form a definite opinion.

Let us go on, I.E.F.

When Greenspun was a candidate for the Republican nomination for governor, no one gave him more active, loyal, honest support than the Tells, with all our hearts and all our energy. We risked our life flying to Ely for Hank. It was in a borrowed plane that needed a booster for the battery to get started, and a pick-up pilot who kept telling us to keep our eyes peeled for level land in case the motor conked out.

We recall an occasion when our admiration for Greenspun reached its highest peak. We said so in no uncertain words, one of the best columns we ever wrote.

A desperate loser was threatening to kill himself with a rifle on the floor of the back seat of a cab. The police had roped off Fremont Street from Main to 3rd. Appeals from the mayor, the police chief, a priest, were to no avail. Then we saw Hank walk up to a window of

EGYPT RIPS SYRIAN ATTACK ON ACCORD

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Egypt's Ambassador to the United Nations sharply criticized Syria for attacking the Israeli-Egyptian accord in a speech by Syrian Foreign Minister Abdul Halim Khaddam to the General Assembly. Observers said they could not recall a previous instance

of public criticism by one Arab spokesman of another Arab representative speech on the Middle East.

Abdel Meguis, the Egyptian UN Ambassador, exercising his right of reply, said that Khaddam's speech in which he attacked the Sinai agreement as a "temporary truce" that threatens the Middle East with a new explosion, represented the view of the Syrian Baath Party not that of the Syrian government.

Khaddam said the accord was a move away from peace and asked, "How could Syria be convinced that the agreement was a step toward peace when Israel was receiving for it, through blackmail, billions of U.S. dollars?" Earlier, Khaddam met for breakfast with Secretary of State Henry Kissinger and then told reporters that there are no prospects for peace with Israel. "All doors for peace are closed."
