# JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM -- Immigrants from the USSR who served in the "Red Army," among them high-ranking officers, are now organizing with the intention to appear as an official delegation at the World Assembly of Jewish War Veterans which will take place in Jerusalem, January 25 to 30, 1976.

CHICAGO -- Lee Schooler, president of the Chicago Crime Commission, died September 28, He was 52,

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- Henry Kissinger, the mediator-initiator of the latest Sinai accord which has divided the Arab world, spent all last week in a heatic diplomatic effort tolenlist support for his Mideast program shuttling back and forth from the UN and his Waldorf-Astoria suite to a number of UN Missions aroung Greater New, York in addition to hosting luncheons and dinners at his suite and the U.S. Mission for the Arabs and other interested parties.

WASHINGTON -- The American Jewish Congress challenged Attorney General Edward H. Levi to come up with "viable alternatives" to legislation the Justice Department has publicly opposed that would prohibit the operation of the Arab boycott in the United States.

NEW YORK -- East European Jewish transmigrants in Rome, most of them Russians, heard special lectures on the meaning and importance of the Jewish holidays during the High Holidays last month. Most of them had been so estranged from Jewish life that this was virtually their first introduction to Judaism.

NEW YORK -- Twenty-five young Americans ranging in age from 18 to 35 departed for permanent settlement in Israel.

LAWRENCE, N.Y. -- A collection of Russian underground literature prepared by some of the leading figures in the Soviet Jewish intelligentsia has been assembled in a new publication and will be distributed free by the Israel International Information Council, POB #11, Lawrence, New York 11559.

NEW YORK -- The Chaplaincy School of the New York Board of Rabbis will commence its second year of instruction offering a course in Pastoral Psychiatry and Care,

NEW YORK -- The American Jewish Committee welcomed the assurances of World Bank President Robert S. McNamara that the Bank did not adhere to the Arab boycott and that it strictly maintained a non-discriminatory policy in its personnel practices.

NEW YORK -- Programs designed to assist Reform synagogues in the United States and Canada bridge the current economic crisis, while at the same time planning for their future growth and development constitutes a primary concern of 3,000 delegates attending the 53rd Biennial General Assembly of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, November 7-II at the Fairmont Hotel in Dallas-Fort Worth.

NEW YORK -- Rabbi Marc H. Tanenbaum, national interreligious affairs director of the American Jewish Committee, addressed the Marine Corps Development and Education Command at the corps training center in Quantico, Virginia.

NEW YORK -- Professor Gershom Scholem, eminent authority on both the history and interpretation of Jewish mysticism will deliver an all-day lecture in connection with the centennial observance of Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, October 16.

NEW YORK -- The annual Hebrew Month observance will begin with a public assembly on Sunday, November 2, 1975, at 2:30 P.M. at the Auditorium of Stern College of the Yeshiva University.

NEW YORK -- The American Jewish Committee has denounced the statements made by Uganda President Idi Amin before the United Nations General Assembly, terming them "an effort to inspire Nazi-like actions in this country, and nothing less than an appeal to genocide."

NEW YORK -- Speaking at a dinner of the American Friends of the Hebrew University Israel Ambassador Simcha Dinitz stressed the importance of maintaining a strong Israel as a priority since the recent Israel - Egypt agreement.

WASHINGTON -- The four major rabbinical groups this week paid tribute to the nation's oldest Jewish organization by officially designating October 17 as B'nai B'rith Sabbath.

NEW YORK -- A renaissance of the Sephardic heritage, to prevent Sephardic Jewry from becoming a cultural minority while remaining a biological majority, was forecast by Liliane Levy Winn, president of the American Sephardi Federation, in a call to the organization's leadership for an assertion of group identity.
