toric Palestine on both sides of the (Jordan) river as well as being the homeland of the great majority of Palestinian Arabs." Allon repeated Israel's position that the Palestinian Liberation Organization "is neither a valid representative of the Palestine Arab community nor a valid interlocutor for Israel." He cited the civil strife in Lebanon as a mockery of the PLO's demand for a secular democratic state of Moslems, Christians and Jews to replace Israel.

Allon charged that the spirit of detente is not evident in the Mideast. He said the Soviet Union has not lived up to the humanitarian provisions of the document signed at the Helsinki Conference on European Security as it applies to the Jewish national minority in the USSR. He expressed the hope that the Soviet Union will allow those Jews who want to emigrate to Israel to do so. Allon also attacked the United Nations for following a "hypocritical and dangerous course" in its attitude toward Israel. He assailed the "mounting of a despicable attack on Zionism by associating it with abhorrent political concepts." Allon contended that anti-Zionism was a euphemism for anti-Semitism and charged that "subscribing to a resolution condemning Zionism means an endorsement of anti-Semitism and legitimization of aggression against Israel."

LAS VEGAS ISRAELITE
HOUSE COMMITTEE APPROVES TECHNICIANS

WASH. (WNS) -- The House International Relations Committee approved this week by a vote of 31-0 the stationing of American technicians in the Sinai passes.

A full vote of approval by the House is expected next week before the Congressional recess for the Columbus Day holiday.

Despite Administration efforts for a similar vote of approval by the Senate, action on the technicians remains mired by a debate in the Senate Foreign Relations Committee on the issue of full official disclosure by the Administration of all documents of

the second Sinai interim accord.

The House Committee vote was limited solely to approval of stationing the technicians to monitor surveillance stations in the Sinai passes.

DEVALUATION MAY LEAD TO STRIFE

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The 10 percent devaluation of the Israel Pound and new taxes may lead to widespread labor strife in Israel.

The Histadrut, under mounting pressure from local labor councils and rank and file workers committees, announced it would demand immediate compensation for wage-earners or the reopening of current contracts if the cost of living index goes up more than five percent. But the Histadrut is also under assault by its members. Eight industrial plants in the Haifa region belonging to the Histadrut-owned Koor Industries, were hit by one-hour work stoppage expressing worker resentment over the way the Histadrut was handling the problem. The Haifa port was paralyzed by a two-

hour walkout of dock workers protesting the devaluation and the new sales tax.

Finance Minister Yehoshua Rabinowitz told the Histadrut Central Committee that the government was determined to resolve the nation's economic problems the "hard way" in order to prevent inflation and unemployment.

ISRAEL CREDENTIALS CONFIRMED AT U.N.

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- The move to oust Israel from the General Assembly has fizzled out.

Sensing that many Africans, Latins and Asians in the Third World are reluctant to join the anti-Israel chorus for the ouster, the Arabs -- with the one exception of Libya -- have retreated from their previous position.

Even the important Credentials Committee -- which passes on the credentials of states -- approved Israel's credentials although Libya, which serves in the Committee with Belgium, China, Costa Rica, Mali, Mongolia, the USSR, the U.S. and Venezuela, objected strenuously. At a subsequent meeting of the whole General

Assembly, the Credentials Committee's approval was confirmed.
