HHH PROPOSES EGYPTIAN-ISRAELI EXCHANGE

NEW YORK (WUP) -- Senator Hubert H. Humphrey has proposed that the Egyptian - Israeli Sinai accord be followed up by a nongovernmental exchange program on a broad range of educational and scientific projects in the region for the betterment of their peoples.

Addressing the Golden Jubilee Scopus Dinner of the American Friends of the Hebrew University at the Waldorf - Astoria Hotel here last week, the noted Senator from Minnesota, in hailing Henry Kissinger's successes in international diplomacy declared: "Let Israeli and Egyptian doctors, scientists, archeologists and farmers begin working together and the time will not be distant when Prime Minister

Rabin and President Sadat face each other across the table."

Humphrey, the recipient of the 1975 Scopus Award along with Isaac Stern and Frank Lautenberg, made it clear that "until face - to - face negotiations take place there can be no lasting peace in the Middle East."

Fully supporting the Sinai accord, he said that he will vote to send technicians to that area and urge other members of the Foreign Relations Committee on which he serves in the Senate to do likewise.

He spoke glowingly of Israel's achievements declaring that "the real strength of Israel is that of the mind and spirit."

The Holocaust Man

Throughout the United States he's known as "the holocaust man."

With the single-mindedness of a Ralph Nadar, Paul Lewis of Dallas, Texas, is keeping alive the memory of the Six Million.

A native of Poland, Mr. Lewis lost relatives to Hitler. He has been in the U.S. since the 20's and here he became a successful builder.

He has been phenomenally vigorous in building tangible memorials to the victims of the Nazis.

In his own congregation, Shearith Israel, of Dallas, he funded a moving memorial, comprising six perpetually burning lamps. He has paid for similar works of art in Washington, Brooklyn, San Antonio, Houston, Chicago, Memphis, Long Beach, California, and a half dozen other cities. Each memorial includes references to the non-Jews who aided our people in their agony.

No wonder the Jewish Theological Seminary awarded Mr. Lewis the Louis Marshall Distinguished Service Medal for his dedication like "no other man of his time" to this sacred task.

No wonder Sen. Javits introduced into the Congressional Record one of Mr. Lewis's eloquent pleas for the preservation of the remembrance of the martyrs.

No wonder millions in our nation admire this earnest philanthropist. I am proud to add my salute.

PARIS (WNS) -- The sale by the United States of Pershing missiles to Israel would, under certain circumstances, threaten the stability of the Middle East, Defense Secretary James Schlesinger told a press conference.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The Israeli government has made a "most emphatic protest" to the President of the General Assembly over the speech by Uganda's President Idi Amin calling for the expulsion of Israel from the United Nations and "the extinction of Israel as a state."

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel plans to return the Abu Rodeis oilfields to Egypt in top condition, including the many improvements it made during the past eight years.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Sylva Zalmanson, the former Soviet "Prisoner of Conscience" is continuing her hunger strike in front of the Isaiah Wall, across from the United Nations, despite pleas from Israeli Foreign Minister Yigal Allon and others that she discontinue it.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Maintaining a strong Israel is a priority following the Israeli-Egyptian agreement on the Sinai, Israel Ambassador Simcha Dinitz declared at a Golden Jubilee Tribute Dinner of the American Friends of the Hebrew University in Port Chester, N.Y.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- A Greek cruise ship with American passengers became the first ship to sail directly from an Egyptian to an Israeli port.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Jews should "use the time" gained by the Israeli-Egyptian agreement "to bring the strong unity of the Jewish people into reality," Israeli Ambassador Simcha Dinitz told some 300 persons attending a dinner of the American Friends of Haifa University.

prefer to answer the two representatives together since, unfortunately for the Arabs, they are playing in one and the same orchestra."

Taking strong objection to Meguid's charge that Khaddam spoke for the Baathist party and not for the people of Syria, Mr. Allaf asked: "Why did you decide together with President Assad and the Baathist party to enter the October war? Why did you wage the battle of liberation with him?"

"We have heard the same tune during the past two weeks from the same Maestro, the United States of America," he continued, "which wanted to put in the newspapers news about a disagreement between the Foreign Minister of Syria and the President of Syria, when they said that Khaddam does not represent the policy of Syria or the policy of Assad."

Then, in what appeared as the most vicious attack on Egypt ever launched by another Arab spokesman, Mr. Allaf declared in utter sarcasm: "The representative of the Egyptian regime said that the Egyptian soldier and the Syrian soldier marched together in the battle of liberation in October 1973. This is true. But the Egyptian soldier withdrew from the battle and left the Syrian soldier, his companion and comrade-in-arms, alone. And this was very unfortunate."

It is no wonder that the Syrians along with the radical Arabs and the PLO are upset over the Egyptian-Israeli agreement. Without Egypt, the most powerful of all the Arab states, their dream of Israel's demise turns to naught and remains only a dream.
