nicians to the Sinai by a 14-2 vote with Democratic Majority Leader Mike Mansfield of Montana and Sen. Joseph Biden (D. Del.) opposed. The Committee acted after Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger reiterated to the Committee that sending the technicians stands alone as a U.S. commitment and that "many provisions" of the four other agreements with Israel and Egypt "are not binding commitments of the U.S." Kissinger said the only binding agreement was that the U.S. would assure that Israel would receive oil to replace that lost by the return of the Abu Rodeis oilfields to Egypt.

Kissinger said the U.S. is coming "to an end of the step-by-step" negotiating process which "must merge with an overall approach." He said that until the Palestine Liberation Organization accepts the existence of Israel "we won't recognize the P.L.O." But he stressed that "a final settlement must provide for the future of Palestinians."

Undersecretary of State Joseph J. Sisco had indicated to Congress earlier this month that some \$10 million would be required for the project's first year and \$7 million annually thereafter. He has also noted that he did not think American technicians would go to the Sinai until some time next March. This would be in keeping with the timetable agreed upon by Israel and Egypt during their negotiations last month to implement the Sinai accord.

Regarding the selection of personnel and responsibility for them, the State Department has been instructed by President Ford to organize, recruit, equip and transport the 200 U.S. personnel. It still remains uncertain whether the Americans will be sought through a contracting firm or recruited from electronic companies which manufacture the equipment which will be used to monitor the warning systems, or by a public call for technicians. Ford has explicitly ruled out military people for the Sinai project.

FORD BACKS CRITICISM OF AMIN

WASH. (WNS) -- President Ford has backed criticism of Uganda President Idi Amin by Daniel P. Moynihan, the American Ambassador to the United Nations, and Clarence Mitchell Jr., a member of the U.S. delegation to the UN.

White House Press Secretary Ron Nessen said Ford believed both statements "needed to be said." Following Amin's speech at the UN General Assembly in which he called for the extinction of the State of Israel and charged that the United States was controlled by Zionists, Moynihan told the AFL-CIO convention in San Francisco that he agreed with a characterization of Amin in a New York Times editorial as a "racist murderer."

Moynihan's statement was denounced by African and Arab delegates at the General Assembly. Tiameu Abijade of Dahomey, speaking for the African bloc, said if Moynihan confused his work at the UN with defending Zionism he should "go to Israel as soon as possible."

Mansur R. Kikia, of Libya, speaking to the Arab League, said Moynihan had violated traditional diplomatic courtesy. Mitchell, who is also director of the Washington Bur-

eau of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People replied that Amin's address was "an affront to millions of citizens of the United States" and the U.S. will respond to any attack on Americans

U.S., ISRAELI INTERESTS MAY DIFFER

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The United States has legitimate interests in the Middle East which may not always coincide with Israel's interest and the recognition of this by Israeli leaders is an important development.

The source said the American aim was to increase United States influence in the Mideast while bringing about a commensurate decrease in Soviet influence although it was impossible to totally exclude the Soviet Union from the Middle East. The diplomat said that it was understandable that Is-

rael would not be pleased by U.S. arms supplies to Egypt but it would be better for Israel.
