ABC/Dot recording artist Tommy Overstreet headlines the ninth edition of "Country Music U.S.A." in the Landmark's Jubilee

Room, along with his band The Nashville Express, Comic Jerry Collins and Three Of A Kind.

Funny man on the scene is Jerry Collins, who is no stranger to Las Vegas showrooms, having appeared with Eddie Arnold, Marty Robbins and many others.
