DENOUNCED BY U.S. AND ISRAEL

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- An Arab-inspired draft reso-(WNS) lution that equated was denounced Israel Zionism with racism Ambassador Chaim Herzog as a shameful and degrading act.

He termed the draft
"a wicked and pernicious anti-Semitic
resolution" and declared: "We shall not forget those who voted to attack our religion and our faith. We shall never for-get." His statement was made after the Third Committee (Social, Humanitarian and Cultural Committee) adopted the draft by a vote of 70 in favor, 29 opposed, 27 ab-staining and 16 ab-sent. JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Syria's refusal so far to negotiate with Israel the renewal of mandate of the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF), which expires November 30, is not Damascus' final word on the subject, according to Foreign Minister Yigal Allon,
He said that Syria's refusal might perhaps

a tactical maneuver and the tactics would yet change. Allon, who recently returned from the United States General Assembly, said he had been informed "officially" that Syria is not interested in any form of negotiations with

interested in any form of negotiations with Israel. Nevertheless, he stated, Israel remains ready to negotiate without preconditions.

Meanwhile, military circles in Israel have denied charges by Damascus, Moscow and terrorist radio reports that Israel has concentrated its forces on the northern border, particularly the Color Heights, since the Sinai accord cularly the Golan Heights, since the Sinai accord with Egypt was, signed. The Israeli military circles said these provocative reports have been circulated before by the Syrians and others opposed to the Sinai pact.

The Syrians have been using an incident in-The Syrians have been using an incident involving the fatal shooting by Israeli forces of two Syrian shepherds on the Golan Heights as proof that Israel is "heating up" the northern border. The Israeli army expressed regret over the incident but noted that the shepherds had strayed across the disengagement line on the Golan Heights and had failed to heed warnings to turn heat. to turn back. An officer of the northern command said that Syrians frequently infiltrate Is-raeli territory for intelligence purposes and purposes and maintain an army unit disguised as Palestinians.

Any time there is a winner at the gaming tables in Nevada, it was just a matter of being at the right place at the right time.

Mostly the timing of arrival at a dice or 21 table is a simple matter of dumb luck, good Often we have heard a loser lament that he just happened to poke his nose in ten minutes too soon or too late.

It's true. Timing is the all important factor in games of chance, especially craps. The next big question is how may the timing be controlled (not left to luck) to play when the dice are hot and back away when they cool off. Perhaps we have stumbled on a simple solution

Before going any further, we tell you here and now that anyone who claims a certain, sure-fire method of beating the gaming tables is a nut. We've read about, and/or listened to, and/or on occasion have observed, practically every system devised by man to beat the house

percentage. Forget it.

What we have come to understand after many years of strolling through casinos, stopping off and on to follow the action, is that every now and then there is a streak at the craps table. It does not happen often, and some are shortlived, but when the passes start coming in bunches, you know it. You can feel the heat and see the oversized betting. Okay, we know the long runs do happen.

Now, how best can our ISRAELITE readers capitalize on the situation? How can they be there at the very beginning of the action? The answer is patience, patience and more

We've seen it happen time and time again, where a player's first wager is a limit bet. He's in a hurry to make it or break it. Seldom

does such a bettor wind up on the plus side. On the other hand we know one chap, a serious gambler, who comes to town about once every He settles himself at a craps table, making nothing but modest bets on the pass line. He then will make two come bets, taking full odds, of course. If a shooter should make two passes, our friend will commence to increase his wagers.

Sometimes it will take three, four or five hours before the long run commences. When it does, he's there. We've seen him operate it does, he's there. We've seen him operate in this manner at least six times and each trip he went home a winner.

Perhaps it could happen to you on your next visit to Las Vegas.
