

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK -- The 23rd Biennial National Convention of Women's American ORT -- the largest ever in the 96-year history of ORT -- elected Ruth Eisenberg of West Orange, N. J. as National President.

WASHINGTON -- President Sadat's bizarre endorsement of the "Zionism is racism" resolution propelled by the Arab bloc at the United Nations "has raised serious questions about his stance as a co-called moderate and the credibility of his willingness to seek permanent and genuine accommodations with Israel," B'nai B'rith said.

CARLISLE, PA. -- The B'nai B'rith Hillel facility on the campus of Dickinson College has evolved as the synagogue, talmud torah and community center for 30 Jewish families.

BRASILIA -- Brazil's support of the Arab-sponsored UN resolution equating Zionism with racism was criticized here by B'nai B'rith President David M. Blumberg as a disappointing break with this country's traditional attitude toward Israel and "in disregard of the sentiments of the Brazilian people."

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J. -- Three thousand orthodox Jewish leaders from every part of the world will assemble here this weekend, beginning Thursday November 6, for a major review of the domestic and overseas policies and programs of Agudath Israel of America, at the organization's 53rd annual convention.

NEW YORK -- Claire Randall, General Secretary of the National Council of Churches of Christ, urged the General Assembly of the United Nations to turn down the resolution of its Social, Humanitarian and Cultural Committee which calls Zionism a "form of racism."

LOS ANGELES -- A goal of \$3,500,000 in endowment funds has been set in the western states by leaders of the four-campus Hebrew Union College, now celebrating its centennial as Reform Judaism's institution of higher learning.

NEW YORK -- The Executive Committee of the National Council of Jewish Women issued a statement urging Congress to set the 1977 budget ceiling only after careful evaluation of programs and program priorities.

NEW YORK -- Responding to the fiscal crisis which threatens to throw the nation's largest city into turmoil, the Committee of Religious Leaders of the City of New York, composed of Catholic, Protestant and Jewish members, has called upon its congregants to join in a Save the City rally on the steps of City Hall.

NEW YORK -- The First National Leadership Conference on Public Affairs will feature a series of workshops and discussions on the "Changed Expectations of Jewish Women" and Urban and Community Crisis at Essex House in New York City, November 26 - 30, 1975.

CHICAGO (WNS) -- Karen DeCrow, the president of the National Organization of Women (N.O.W.), declared here that nations and groups that discriminate against Jews usually also discriminate against women.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The United States is not holding up arms supplies to Egypt so as not to embarrass Egyptian President Anwar Sadat during his visit to this country, State Department spokesman Robert Anderson told newsmen.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- A state-wide investigation of cemetery-vandalism was urged by Assemblyman Charles Schumer (D, Bklyn) after he found dozens of tombstones damaged at a Jewish cemetery in the Bensonhurst section of Brooklyn.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- There has been little improvement in the social absorption of American immigrants to Israel, Mrs. Charlotte Jacobson, chairman of the World Zionist Organization --American Section, told the WZO Executive here. Aliya department head Rabbi Mordechai Kirschblim said 2546 American Jews had made aliya to Israel so far this year.



A Proclamation by the Governor

WHEREAS, for more than two centuries men and women on our continent have willingly sacrificed time, talent and ability in service to our nation and our American ideals of freedom during times of war; and

WHEREAS, throughout the history of our nation the American fighting men and women have been recognized throughout the world for their willingness to lay down their lives in defense of the principles on which our country was built; and

WHEREAS, in our society today there are thousands of men and women who have seen service with the American Armed Forces and have suffered injury or loss, or have had friends fall beside them, never to rise again; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that we set aside a day to honor the veterans of military service to our State and Nation, and that the day chosen should commemorate a historic event in our nation's military history such as the armistice which concluded fighting in World War I;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MIKE O'CALLAGHAN, Governor of the State of Nevada do hereby proclaim November 11, 1975, as

VETERANS DAY

a legal holiday in the State of Nevada.



In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Nevada to be affixed at the State Capitol in Carson City, this 24th day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventy-five.
