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How About Plight Of Jewish Refugees

Anti-Israel propagandists have shed a great deal of crocodile tears over the years about the plight of the Palestinian refugees. But little been heard about another group of refugees, the Jews from Arab lands who had to flee their homes leaving behind most of their possessions.

Their plight has not been taken up by international bodies perhaps because, unlike the Palestinians, most of whom were forced to stay in refugee camps by their fellow Arabs, the Jewish refugees sought to make a new life for themselves in Israel, France and elsewhere, But now with the intensified assault on Zionism and Jews in the United States, the time has come to remind the world that the Palestinians are not the only ones to have become refugees as a result of a Middle East conflict.

That is why it is good news to hear from Paris that Jews from Arab countries will meet there at the end of the month to form a new group, the World Organization of Jews from Arab Countries (WOJAC), WOJAC's organizers stress that the group's objective is to strive for peace in the Middle East by recognizing the legitimate rights of Jews from Arab countries in the spirit of the UN Security Council Resolution 242 which calls for "a just solution of the refugee problem."

As the organizers point out 800,000 Jews fled the Arab countries of the Middle East and North Africa as compared to 590,000 Arabs who There has been much talk about Israel. 
Behind The Scenes At The United Nations

Arab U.N. Ouslaught

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- The current intensified Arab attack upon Zionism and the Jewish State in the General Assembly and in the several Committees is fraught with all the perilous elements which served as the basis of the Palestinian-Islamic onslaught against World Jewry during the dramatic struggle that culminated in the narrow-margin victory on Partition a generation ago.

Ever since that historic occasion, resulting in the establishment of the State of Israel, the malcontent Arabs and their partners-in-crime have never given up the hope of reversing the UN decision on Partition, Enjoying the full support of the 'tyranny of the majority' which legalized the murderous PLO, they have chosen this month of November in a desperate attempt

to push through their objective.

What they failed to accomplish, diplomatically, in 1947, and militarily, in 1948, 1956, 1967 and 1973, they now believe they may be able to get by way of a world organization beholden to them. One thing will evolve this November, Israel and world Jewry will know who their real friends are. They are not many, but they are also not few.

November is an historic month for Israel and her enemies know this only too well. The Balfour Declaration was issued on November 2. 1917, and on November 29, 1947, the three-yearold United Nations placed its seal of approval on Jewish sovereignty. The Arabs never accepted these two historic decisions. Yasir Arafat's spokesman at this session, Farouk Kaddoumy, in addressing the Assembly last

week, was completely open on this point.
Said the PLO terrorist: "Our people sincerely hope that this session will adopt a decisive measure to impose penalties on Israel, including a review of its membership in the United Nations. We also hope that the UN will form a special committee to combat Zionism. to curtail its activities and put an end to its crimes, in the same way it combatted fascism, nazism, and all other anti-human ideologies..." He termed the Balfour Declaration "a permanent blot of shame in the history of humanity.

Kaddoumy told the Assembly that the date of November 2, 1917, "has been struck out from our Palestinian calendar and replaced by the day 70 friendly states (in the Third Committee) stood together boldly to condemn Zionism as an oppressive, racist, backward and dangerous ideology... This condemnation confirmed that the democratic state in Palestine is the only true vision ...
