tinued existence of this organization which has been dragged to its lowest point of discredit by a coalition of despotisms and racists."

The Israeli envoy said that "For us the Jew lish people, this is but a passing enjoyed in a ish people, this is but a passing episode in a rich and event-filled history. We put our trust in Providence, in our faith and beliefs, in our time-hallowed traditions, and in our people wherever they may be."

David Wilson, the Liberian representative, in opposing the resolution noted that 20 Black African countries had not supported the anti-Zionist measure. He said that he had not heard either in the Assembly or its Third Com-mittee any definition of what made Zionism racist. He also deplored the fact that the debate on Zionism caused the delegates to obscure the argument against apartheid. Later, Gaston Thorn, President of the General Assembly, warned that the Assembly's action had "evil consequences" and castigated the 32 nations which had abstained, "How could they have abstained from accepting their responsibilities?" he asked. Although he made it clear that he spoke as Prime Minister of Luxembourg, Thorn's remarks were viewed as unprecedented criticism by the head of the General Assembly of a decision taken by the body. Noting that he feared the conse-quences of the resolution, Thorn said "I can only hope that this realization will allow a sufficiently large number of delegations to put things he said.

The two pro-PLO resolutions were adopted earlier by wide margins. The Assembly first adopted by a 101-8 vote with 25 abstentions an Eguptian-sponsored resolution calling for the PLO's participation in all Middle East negotia-tions "on an equal footing" with all parties. The resolution instructed UN Secretary General Kurt Waldheim to inform the United States and the Soviet Union, the co-chairmen of the Geneva conference, to take all necessary steps to invite the PLO to participate in its work "as well as all other efforts for peace." The second resolution, sponsored by 50 East European and Third World countries, was adopted by a 93-18 vote with 27 abstentions. It calls for the establishment of a 20-member General Assembly committee to draft plans to implement the Assembly's 1974 Palestine resolutions which support the right of national independence and self-determination for the Palestinians and af-firms the right of the Palestinians to "return to the homes and property from which they were uprooted."

Herzog told the Assembly that the two resolutions "are utterly unacceptable" to the Israeli government and create "an impasse" in the Mideast for which the states that voted for them bear responsibility. He reiterated that Israel will not "under any circumstances" negotiate with the PLO which, he said, is bent on the destruction of Israel. In Jerusalem, Premier Yitzhak Rabin also declared that "No resolu-tion of the UN General Assembly will bind Israel to negotiate with the terrorist organization.

100,000 AT NY PROTEST RALLY JERUSALEM BLAST LINKED TO RESOLUTION

More than 100,000 persons poured into Manhattan's garment center in an angry, but orderly, protest against the resolution adopted by the United Nations General Assembly which equated Zionism with racism.

The demonstrators included Jews and Christians, Whites and Blacks from New York and cities as far away as Dallas and Toronto. Rabbi Israel Miller, chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, which organized the raily, said the "voices of hate are raised against Zionism but are directed at all free people." He said the rally was not only against racism and anti-Semitism but for "international justice, decency, morality, for liberal democracy, for values which gave birth to the United Nations, for the Jewish people and for Israel." President Ford in a message read to the

rally, said "Your gathering here today is a reaffirmation of the American belief in justice and basic human values." He said the UN was weakened by the resolution and promised that the U.S. "will remain steadfast in its support of freedom and democracy, justice and the

rights of all people."

Chaim Herzog, Israel's Ambassador to the UN, praised the U.S. and West European countries for opposing the resolution and noted for the first time in many year, "the majority of the Black African nations refused to support an anti-Israel resolution in the face of Arab pressure." Re-ferring to his dramatic gesture in the General Assembly when he tore up the resolution, Herzog declared, "I tore it up in your behalf and thus, for the Jews, it no longer exists." He said that while addressing the Assembly, "I somehow sensed at that moment the feeling of the Jewish

heart beating as one throughout the world."

Mrs. Leah Rabin, wife of Israeli Premier
Yitzhak Rabin, said "we are the only ones to
decide our future" because with the establishment of the State of Israel, Jews are no longer the objects of persecution. Bayard Rustin, the Black civil rights leader, declared that "the racists who enslaved my people" are trying to make racists out of some of the most prominent defenders of civil rights and opponents of racism who are Jews.

Feminist leader Betty Frieden called on women to denounce the racist resolution adopted by the General Assembly.
