## Blood on UN Hands

The first direct consequence of the shameful resolution adopted by the United Nations General Assembly branding Zionism as a form of racism may have been the explosion in downtown Jerusalem three days later which killed several people and injured scores of others.

The Assembly majority, in adopting the anti-Zionist measure along with two pro-Palestine Liberation Organization resolutions, were attacking the legitimacy of the State of Israel and of Judaism itself. The countries who supported the anti-Zionist resolution were signaling the terrorists to kill innocent men, women and children since after all they were nothing but racists or "settlers" as they call Israelis.

The resolution also endangers Jewish communities in countries like the Soviet Union and Syria where Jews are already being harassed and imprisoned. They now could be simply labelled as Zionists and these governments arrest them at will.

In addition, the three anti-Zionist resolutions, endanger the delicate Middle East peace negotiations and the countries that voted for them will be in good part responsible if they fail.

The United States, Canada, the Western European and other countries who opposed the anti-Zionist resolution must now seek through political and economic means to force the Assembly to expunge this outrage. For, until it does, the continued existence of the United Nations itself is in doubt and Israel will not be the only democratic country in danger.

fore murderous hatred of the Jews and Israel in all its deep-rooted satanism. It was as if one witnessed again the reappearance of all of Israel's ancient enemies -- Amalek, Pharaoh, Antiochus, Apion and Haman -- on the modern scene incarnated in the evil and fleshly frames of the Syrians and their PLO-Philistine henchmen, the Egyptians, the Libyans, the Kuwaitis, the Iraqis, the Jordanians, the Soviets, the Indians, the Pakistanis, the Ugandians et company.

It was a day in which "a great evil was loosed upon the world," as Ambassador Moynihan indignantly termed it.

The Hitlerian-type spectacle had its opening in the full General Assembly during its morning session that witnessed the adoption of two pro-PLO resolutions -- calling, in effect, for the undoing of Israel -- and resumed in the afternoon and evening meetings -- during which a move, made on the part of a number of right-thinking delegations to defer the debate on the issue of Zionism, was out-voted by a small margin -- culminating in the approval of the 'big lie' draft equating Zionism with racism.

Significantly, the vigilant move to defer the debate until next year came as a blow to the 'tyranny of the majority.' It lost adoption by a mere 12 votes. The Arabs mustered only 67 against it. 55 states voted in favor and there were 15 abstentions. So here we had 70 votes not going along with Israel's enemies. Among the 70 were not only Western and Latin states but a great many Africans and Asians.

The vote on the anti-Semitic resolution itself was also not fully reflective of the 'tyranny of the majority' which evolved last year during Yasir Arafat's scandalous visit. The Arabs and their friends got only 72 votes. 35 voted against the draft with 32 abstentions while 3 did not participate in the voting. Thus, if Brazil and Mexico had gone along with their Latin colleagues and not vote as they did for expediency's sake, the Arabs would have been confronted with the fact of being matched by an equal number (72) of Member States who did not join their bandwagon. Moreover, some observers here hold to the belief that had the U.S. been more vigilant during and after the Third Committee adopted the anti-Semitic draft on October 17, it is entirely possible that the resolution would never have won a majority in the Assembly.

But it happened and the infamy is on record for historians to note.

Anticipating this infamy, Ambassador Chaim Herzog, who was supported by a large number of delegations, spoke out bluntly soon after the Assembly voted against deferring the debate. "It is symbolic," he declared, "that this debate should take place on 10 November. This night, 37 years ago, has gone down in history as the Kristallnacht. This was the night of 10 November, 1938, when Hitler's Nazi storm-troopers launched a coordinated attack on the Jewish community in Germany, burnt the syna-

To equate Zionism with racism is to call black white, right wrong, up down. It is a contradiction of reason. Grand Rabbi Moses Rosen of Rumania said, "Jews have always been the first victims of racism." He added, "the resolution (passed by the U.N.) not only is against Jews, it is against all religions; it is against the word of God."

President Ford said: "We strongly deplore the linkage of Zionism and racism."

U.S. Ambassador to the U.N. Daniel P. Moynihan, after a lengthy speech denouncing the resolution and explaining the meanings of Zionism and racism, said: "I am here making one point, and one point only, which is that whatever else Zionism may be, it is not and cannot be a form of racism. In logic, the State of Israel could not become racist unless it ceased to be Zionist."

Costa Rican Foreign Minister Gonzalo Facio said: "This attack against Zionism is a politely worded way of reviving anti-Semitism, which created the horrors of the Nazi era... it justifies and encourages hostility to Zionism, which is the national liberation movement of a people that for generations was subject to racial oppression."

Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko, who wholeheartedly supported the anti-Zionist resolution last week had this definition of Zionism back in 1947 at the same U.N.: "The Jewish people in defending its rights and physical survival against the violent deeds of the Hitlerites, explains the aspiration of the Jews to create their own State. It will be unjust if we ignore this aspiration and deny the Jewish people the right to realize it."

British novelist Iris Murdoch wrote: "The stubborn retention of identity by the Jews is remarkable, but scarcely racist, in the pejorative (worse) sense."

Rabbi Sol Roth, president of the N.Y. Board of Rabbis, declared: "Zionism, Judaism and the Jewish people, are inextricably connected with one another and, despite Arab and Third World mealy-mouthed, brazen expressions to the contrary, this attack on Zionism is an attack on the Jewish people, its religion and the State of Israel. Of all national movements, Zionism, which has created a State where people of every race, religion and national background enjoy the fullest measure of freedom, is anything but racial."

Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin told the Knesset: "There is no crueller or greater irony than, that Zionism -- that continuous struggle of an ancient people for freedom in its own land, ever since its emergency from slavery to freedom in ancient Egypt, the people which, more than any other, has made unequalled contributions to the values of human freedom -- that people is besmirched today with the stigma of racism."

It was about 18 months ago when the Arabs embarked on their propaganda campaign against the Jews. A year ago the Arab terrorist leader Yassar Arrafat spoke at the U.N.

Since then came discrimination against Israel at UNESCO, where Egypt proclaimed, "It is inevitable that we escalate the campaign of isolating and rejecting Israel from the international community and from the U.N."

Then in Mexico at the International Women's Year World Conference, the automatic Arab majority declared Zionism, along with colonialism, foreign occupation, apartheid and racial discrimination, must be eliminated.

At the conference of the Organization of African Unity, in Uganda, and at the Conference of Nonaligned Nations, in Peru, the Arabs coerced the members into endorsing anti-Zionist slander.

There is no question that the real victim of Arab attacks against Jews will be the U.N. itself.
