gogues in all the cities and made bonfires in streets of the Holy Books and the scrolls of the Holy law and the Bible...It was a night which led eventually to the crematoria and the gas to Auschwitz, Birkenau, Dachau, Theresienstadt, and others, It chambers. Buchenwald, It was the night which led to the most horrifying holocaust in the history of man ...

Comparing the current anti-Jewish groupings here to the Nazi alliance of 30 years ago, Her-zog told the Assembly that "Hitler would have felt at home on a number of occasions during the past years listening to the proceedings in this forum and shows all to the proceedings this forum and, above all, to the proceedings during the debate on Zionism." He went on to charge that "the attack

on Zionism constitutes not only an anti-Semitic attack of the foulest type, but also an attack in this world body on Judaism, one of the oldest - established religions in the world, a religion which has given the world the human values of the Bible, a religion from which two other great religions, Christianity and Islam, sprang. Is it not tragic," he continued, "to consider that we here, at this meeting, in the year 1975, are contemplating what is a scurri-lous attack on a great and established religion lous attack on a great and established religion that has given to the world the Bible with its Ten Commandments; the great prophets of old, Moses, Isaiah, Amos; the great thinkers of history, Maimonides, Spinoza, Marx, Ein-

stein; many of the masters of the arts, and as high a percentage of Nobel Prize winners in the world, in the sciences, in the arts and the humanities, as has been achieved by any other people on earth.

Chaim Herzog went on at length to define the true nature and meaning of Zionism. "Zion-ism." he said, "is nothing more, and nothing less, than the Jewish people's sense of origin and destination in the land linked eternally with its name. It is also the instrument whereby the lawish people are authorized followers Jewish nation seeks an authentic fulfillment of itself. And the drama is enacted in the region in which the Arab Nation has realized its sovereignty in 20 states comprising a hundred million people in four and a half million square miles, with vast resources. The issue, there-fore, is not whether the world will come to terms with Arab nationalism. The question is at what point Arab nationalism, with its presti-gious glut of advantage, wealth and opportunity will come to terms with the modest but equal rights of another Middle Eastern nation to pursue its life in security and peace." This correspondent stated in last week's

column that "one thing will evolve this Novem-Israel and world Jewry will know who ber their real friends are. They are not many, but they are also not few."

As it turned out, there are quite a few, many more than what was expected. Daniel Patrick Moynihan led the growing list which included all the Western countries, France and Italy among them and the Scandinavians, the great majority of the Latin states. They all spoke up powerfully against the resolution; Costa Rica and Liberia and Haiti excelled in their denunciation of the draft. The Ivory Coast, Central African Republic, Fiji. Mallawi, Swaziland, the Bahamas and Barbados also stood valiantly with Israel in opposing Jewry's enemies.

The Arabs felt let-down. They had antici-ated greater support, especially from the fricans and Asians. The number of these Africans and Asians. states that abstained shocked them. Among these were Ghana, Kenva, Lesotho, Mauritius, Sierra Leone, Togo, Upper Voltz, Zaire, Zambia, Bot-

swana, Ethiopia and Gabon. Also Japan, Nepal, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Singapore, Thai-land, Burma, in addition to several Latins. Daniel Patrick Moynihan, in one of the most militant speeches ever heard here at the UN, warned the Assembly that "the terrible lie that has been told here today will have terrible con has been told here today will have terrible con-sequences. As this day will live in infamy, it behooves those who sought to avert it that we were not small in number -- not this time --and that while we lost, we fought with full knowledge of what indeed would be lost."
