If enough funds are not raised by the first of next year, Southern Nevada will be deprived of a much needed Animal Adoption Center.

That is why Jim Marsh, owner of AMC, Jeep, Volvo, Mazda Agency, in cooperation with K-RAM, modern country radio, will present a "SAVE THE ANIMALS" radiothon on Friday, November 28 from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Many feature attractions are planned including pedigree dog and cat shows, 4-H show, and a children's pet contest, for which entry forms may be obtained at Jim Marsh's, 2570 So.
