of untruth and outrage. The lie is that Zionism is a form of racism. The overwhelmingly clear truth is that it is not."

After having spoken at length on the true meaning of Zionism as one of the world's first genuine liberation movements, the dynamic U.S. Ambassador warned the United Nations by charging that "the terrible lie that has been told here today will have terrible consequences. Not only will people begin to say, as they have indeed already begun to say, that the UN is a place where lies are told, but far more serious, grave and perhaps irreparable harm will be done to the cause of human rights. The harm," he stated, "will arise first because it will strip from racism the precise and abhorrent meaning that it still precariously holds today. How will peoples of the world feel about racism, and about the need to struggle against it, when they are told that it is an idea so broad as to include the Jewish national liberation movement?"

Daniel Patrick Moynihan, who last week was on the verge of resigning because of an attempt to muzzle him by his own State Department for having made speeches such as cited here, concluded his historic November 10 address with this definitive declaration:

"The United States of America declares that it does not acknowledge, it will not abide by, it will never acquiesce in this infamous act!"

Had the White House allowed him to resign, then this his statement would have turned to naught and Israel's as well as the whole Free world's enemies would have gloated over what they considered a "victory" over the Jewish people and over all truly democratic nations around the globe.

Undoubtedly, the Israeli delegation, of all the delegations here, was the most relieved with the news that Moynihan would not leave his post. Addressing a group of Jewish leaders in New York soon after the "day of infamy", Israeli Ambassador Chaim Herzog, in a lengthy analysis of the situation, said that "it took the U.S. delegation, led by Ambassador Moynihan, to characterize this new attack on Jewry as an obscene act, to protest formally to the world in the name of the U.S. and to announce that this was nothing but the lowest form of anti-Semitism with all that implies.

"My friends," Herzog added, "you can be proud of your delegation to the United Nations which before anybody else appreciated the sinister significance of this move when we in our delegation sounded the alarm, and which stood up and supported us in our hour of struggle...."

Chanukah Message

NEW YORK -- In a Chanukah message, Dr. Joseph P. Sternstein, President of the Zionist Organization of America, issued a call to world Jewry to join the Honor Roll of Zionists. Dr. Sternstein's message follows:

"The Jewish people are observing Chanukah when the political and military forces are arrayed against it. We recall the Chanukah spirit of the Maccabees who emerged victorious against a seemingly invincible enemy because of the rightness of their cause and their inner strength and indomitable spirit.

We recall the battle cry of the heroic Matthias, 'Those who are for the Lord join with me.' This battle cry must be echoed in our day, as a call to world Jewry and friends of Zionism to join the honor roll of Zionists by enrolling in the Zionist Organization of America.

Israel has been told by the United Nations that Zionism is racism, that Israel has no past, present, or future; but the torch of Maccabean valor has been passed through the generations and continues to burn brightly during Chanukah, the Festival of Lights.

We call upon American Jewry to reach out and let the world know that Zionism is one of the noblest liberation movements in modern history. We cannot adopt a business-as-usual attitude. Now is the time for bold, innovative, and courageous actions if the Jewish community is to survive, not only in Israel but throughout the world.

And we will survive, for like the heroes of Chanukah, we are the few against the many, and in our unity we have always had great, unconquerable strength."

Fresno Fresco

Ever hear of a statue dedicated to a living person?

There's one in Fresno, California and the person it honors is a rabbi.

Since 1931 Rabbi David Greenberg, a native of Stockton, Calif. has served Temple Beth Israel. It was his only pulpit.

Now formally retired, he is still the spiritual guide of thousands in that lovely California city and he will be conducting High Holiday services at the Castle Air Base in Merced, Calif.

No clergyman has served in his city longer than Dr. Greenberg. What makes his ministry notable is that for seventeen years he and a Catholic priest and a Protestant minister did a weekly radio program called Forum of Better Understanding.

So powerful an impression did the program make that the citizens of Fresno raised \$10,000 for a handsome sculpture which was built on the grounds of the county court house and dedicated in 1969. The work of art was a tribute to the interfaith trio.

By that time his colleagues had died, but Dr. Greenberg carries on in the ecumenical spirit. Way back in 1947 he was given a doctor of divinity degree in California's oldest private college, the University of the Pacific Methodist school.

Since then the rabbi, a professional social worker, has been saluted by the Masons, the Elks, the B'nai B'rith, the Jewish Welfare Federation (which he headed) and by every civic group in town. In May of this year he was given a testimonial dinner to which everyone came. No one glowed more brightly than his gifted wife, Estelle, who, he avows, has been his inspiration.

He was also inspired by the man who ordained him, the late, great Stephen Wise. Among his other admirers was the late Earl Warren, principal speaker years ago at gatherings in his honor.

On the Fresno fresco the rabbi's profile is seen. It is well for the rest of us to see in him one of the nation's most blessed servants of God and leaders of men!
