Another important consideration respecting the UN vote equating Zionism with racism is the fact that in spite of Dr. Kissinger saying in Pittsburg after the UN vote that there mdy be some reaction against the UN by the US, a few days later he cooled off and said the resolution will be considered as a piece of paper and he encouraged Congress not to hold back any funds from nations because of their votes. And some Congressmen visiting the UN Secretary General were of the opinion we should cool off. But fortunately Senator Henry M. Jackson said, "Many in Congress and others will never forget that resolution." And he predicted that many will come to us for foreign aid and find "that foreign aid will cause them to reconsider their decision."

There is no doubt the remarks of Ambassador Moynihan and his staff in the UN US Mission were effective, and also the US backed proposal to postpone consideration of the resolution. But it was the nine European common market nations who sent strong warnings to 65 capitals saying the resolution endangered the future of the UN. The Swedes and other Scandinavians lobbied strongly in selected capitals where their influence is greatest. And they sent emissaries. However, everywhere they went, the Arabs had been there before. They got responses like, "This is what they offered us for our vote, what will you offer?" The Libyans were particularly active to offer cash for votes.

During all this the State Department was relatively inactive, much to the annoyance of some Americans involved in the effort. And the State Department considered the resolution merely anti-Zionist and mere rhetoric, and said, "It doesn't get priority," This was a remark

made by an official. Many Jewish people in the U.S. who are planning trips abroad have asked their travel agents to omit from their itinery countries that voted in favor of that infamous resolution. And three major faiths joined hands to sponsor seminars, the distribution of literature and use of 16 mm films to promote a deeper understanding of Judaism, the Jewish people and a need of closer Jewish-Christian relationship.
