## CATHOLICS: JEWS BOUND TO ISRAEL

WASH. (WNS) --e National Con-The National Con-ference of Catholic Bishops meeting here voted 190-6 to adopt a 12-page statement acknowledging the Jewish people's his-toric "bond" to the land of Israel and calling on Catholics "to understand this link" without denying "the legitimate rights of other concerned parties" in the Mideast,

The phrase garding legitimate rights was inserted at the insistance of Archbishop Joseph Twaill of West Newton. Mass., a Melchite Rite prelate, who observed that the current fighting in Lebanon is of concern to all in the Mideast. The statement made it clear that the "appreciation of this link (that Jews have with Israel) is not to give assent to any particular religious fighting particular religious interpretation of this bond nor to deny the legitimate rights of other concerned parties in the region. Nor is it to adopt any poli-tical stance in the controversy over the

Middle East, which is beyond the purvue of this statement."

The bishops' state-ent also hailed the historic changes in Jewish - Catholic relations effected by the Second Vatican Council 10 years ago and called for further Catholic action to advance "the trustion. The munication. U.S. were urged by the bishops to give "special attention" to "create and sup-port whatever instrument or agency is appropriate for carrying out the strument or carrying out recommendations 'Nostra Aetate'.'
