Washington, D.C. -- Although it was not intended to be a major point of departure in the Annual National Conference of Catholic Bishops -- meeting here this week -- continued friction over Jewish attitudes toward granting aid to parochial schools drew heavy attention, almost overshadowing other issues such as a plea for decent housing for all Americans and a guarantee of jobs for everyone.

Capturing the tone of the dissention was Wil-

liam Willoughby, Religion Editor of the WASHINGTON STAR, who is a veteran observer of the Catholic-Jewish scene in the Nation's

capital

Willoughby's report of the action centered on remarks made by John Cardinal Krol, Archbishop of Philadelphia, who said that Catholics need to be frank with Jews on attitudes re-flected by many Jews against Catholic efforts to obtain public funds for their school operations.

"I think we're shortchanging our Jewish friends if we don't call attention to a very disturbing fact in our relations," Krol said. turbing fact in our relations," Krol said. His remarks came as Washington's Arch-

bishop William W. Baum presented the conference with a statement commemorating the 10th anniversary of Nostra Aetate, a landmark Varican II document which set in motion an extensive and continuing dialogue with Ameri-

Even though Krol didn't identify the groups, Willoughby explained that they are the American Jewish Congress and the B'nai B'rith Anti-Defamation League both of which have consistently joined other groups such as the American Civil Liberties Union, Americans United For Separation of Church and State, the NAACP and the National Education Association in opposing tax credits and other types of aid for paro-chial school children or their parents. Rabbi Marc Tannenbaum, national director

of the AJC's interreligious affairs department, said before the bishops convened, "The fact that there are today networks of Jews and

Christians who meet regularly, share common and respective concerns, is a development of unprecedented, even historic, importance.

To my knowledge, there has never been such extensive interaction on a personal, social professional basis between Jews and Christians in any period of history during the past 1900 years as there is today, especially in the U.S."

The statement, adopted at the conclusion of conference says, 'We do not wish to convey the conference says, 'We do not wish to convey the impression that all our problems are behind There still exist areas of disagreement and roversy which separate the Jewish and controversy which separate the Catholic communities. We should like to believe that the difficulties can be resolved to some degree in amicable dialogue."

The statement says that, while there is good reason to believe that anti-Semitism is at its lowest ebb in history, "there is no ground to presume that it has been permanently elimina-

It says that since the implementation of Nostra Aetate there has been a decline in old "anti-Judaic theology" which had been widely voiced by Catholics, principal of which was that Jews were and are collectively guilty of the death of

The statement says that the Vatican document goes beyond the notion of "exoneration" of the Jewish people. "The truth is that the (Vatican) Council acknowledged that the Jewish people never were, nor are they now, guilty of the death of Christ."

The statement acknowledges a growing con-sensus among Jews that compositely they are a

people racially, ethnically, and religiously en-twined and with a special affinity for Israel. The statement does say that Christians should strive to understand the attitude of many Jews toward Israel. It urges that Catholics at all levels continue to carry out the spirit of Nostra Aetate, and that preachers and liturgists show genuine appreciation "of the special place of the Jewish people as God's first-chosen in the history of salvation and in no way slight the honor and dignity that is theirs.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Shabtei Rosenne, a legal advisor in the Israel Foreign Ministry, has expressed optimism that the Red Magen David Society in Israel will be admitted into the League of Red Cross Societies when the issue comes up in April at the diplomatic conference of Reaffirmation of Humanitarian Law in Geneva.
