ISRAEL URGES ARAB STATES TO RISE ABOVE HATE AND TO WORK FOR PEACE

(RESOLUTION CONDEMNING ISRAEL FOR LEBANON RAID WAS VETOED BY U.S. IN THE U.N. SECURITY COUNCIL.)

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Chaim Herzog, Israel's Ambassador to the United Nations, urged the Arab states "to rise above the hate, bitterness and intransigence of their words, to liberate themselves from the chain of their slogans and join with us in setting out together along the road toward peace and a better life in the Middle East."

Speaking during the General Assembly's Middle East debate, Herzog said the basic issue in the area is "a change of heart with respect to Israel on the part of the Arab countries. Until that change is achieved, no meaningful advance can really be attained in the Middle East." But the Israeli envoy declared that Israel is prepared to enter into negotiations "at any moment without any preconditions whatsoever" with its Arab neighbors. However, he stressed that Israel will negotiate only on the basis of recognition of its sovereign rights and will accept no dictates from any quarter. "We will not negotiate our own suicide," he added.

Herzog reiterated Israel's position that progress toward peace can be made in the framework set by Security Council resolutions 242 and 338. Herzog later denied claims by some in Israel that his remarks could be interpreted as a softening on the Israeli stand on the PLO. Herzog emphatically denied this saying "my statement did not imply in any way a change in policy on the part of Israel toward the PLO." In Jerusalem, the Foreign Ministry also denied

When a faction takes over a group organized for mutual interest, and the faction rules with ulterior motive, then that group ceases to exist.

For all intents and purposes Israel is up against a stone wall at the United Nations. The majority of the Soviet/Arab/African bloc is an impasse that cannot be overcome. There was the hope, at one time, the unorthodox majority would split on occasion, just as honest, reasonable minds differ in opinion. But this is not so at the U.N.

Little countries, desperately cowed by the threat of losing Russian arms or Arab oil money, vote as they are told, rather than according to their conscience. Not only that, but they are coerced into introducing and instigating matters that are foreign to their own interests or concern. That is why anti-Israeli resolutions were introduced at a UNESCO conference in Geneva, a women's meeting in Mexico and an African Unity confab on the dark continent. Members come from all over the world to attend a committee session for a uniform purpose of understanding, conformity and progress, and inevitably the subject matter is turned to an anti-Israel resolution.

The U.N. is no longer a world body debating issues going on in every corner of our earth. It has deteriorated into an anti-Jewish forum. After the war in Vietnam, the Communists forced hundreds of thousands of people in Cambodia to march away from their homes and lands into nowhere. Without food, water, sustenance of any kind, thousands died. Not a peep at the U.N.

There is a vicious, undeclared war raging in Lebanon. Hundreds are killed every day. Beautiful, modern properties are being laid to waste. Nothing is said about this tragedy at the U.N.

All the machinery, all the great diplomatic minds of the world, are embroiled in resolutions against Israel. This maddening waste of brainpower is to serve one purpose and one purpose only, the elimination of the State of Israel. To accomplish this with the least risk of failure, it first becomes necessary to alienate the mutual friendship that exists between Israel and the United States. The only way to sever the ties that bind the two democracies is to propagandize the Arab cause to the average Joe in America. Which is exactly what is being attempted right now at the U.N., backed up by

UN'S FAO COMPROMISES ZIONISM ISSUE

ROME (WNS) -- The United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) ended its three-week governing conference after narrowly avoiding a split on the issue of Zionism.

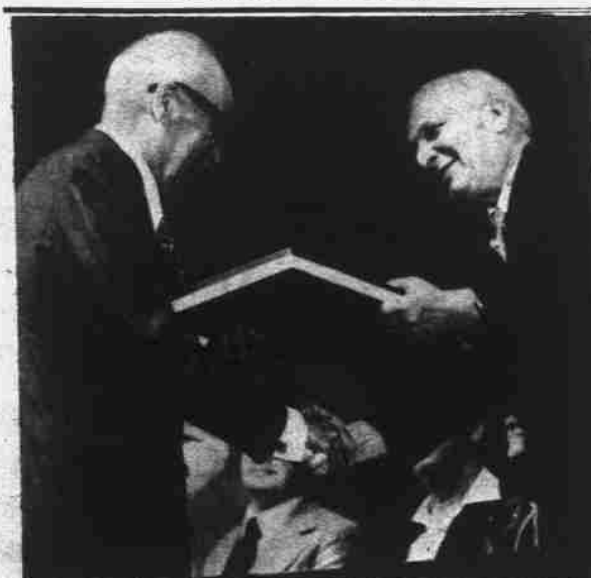
The controversy arose when the United States, Israel and 25 other countries opposed the inclusion of the term racism in a resolution urging the FAO to extend

food aid to liberation movements recognized by the UN General Assembly and the Organization of African Unity which were "struggling against foreign domination or racism." The compromise worked out was that "racism" should not be understood as referring to Zionism.

The biennial conference which increased FAO's budget to \$167 million for 1976-77, a 50 percent hike, assessed Israel's contribution at more than \$250,000. This is more than three times that of Saudi Arabia's contribution and nearly twice as much as that of Libya which had called for the expulsion of Israel from the FAO.
