

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK -- El Al Israel Airlines will receive on December 20, the 1975 Stephen S. Wise Award for distinguished service to Israel, the American Jewish Congress announced.

NEW YORK -- Vidal Sassoon -- a pioneering figure in women's hairstyling and a hero of Israel's War of Independence -- will be the guest of honor at the first annual Beauty Hall of Fame award dinner of the American Jewish Congress at the Pierre Hotel Sunday evening, December 14.

NEW YORK -- Eighty-two full-length feature films of Jewish interest available to local communities are included in a new catalog of selected films which has just been published by the JWB Lecture Bureau, 15 East 26th Street, New York, N.Y. 10010.

NEW YORK -- Scores of recently arrived Russian immigrants celebrated Chanukah, the Festival of Lights, for the first time in their lives at a Chanukah party sponsored jointly by NYANA -- New York Association for New Americans -- and Al Tidom Association.

NEW YORK -- The U.S. - Israel Advisory Council on Research and Development, which consists of leading American R & D executives, scientists and engineers, departed for Israel.

NEW YORK -- Natalia (Avital) Sharansky, separated from her husband Anatoly, and her brother Mikhail Shtriglit, are touring the United States under the auspices of the National Conference on Soviet Jewry.

NEW YORK -- Scholars, theologians, clergymen and religious educators from all parts of the United States, to advance mutual respect, attended a national conference of Evangelical Christians and Jews co-sponsored by the American Institute of Holy Land Studies, Jerusalem, Israel, and the American Jewish Committee.

NEW YORK -- Less than three weeks after the U.N. adopted the anti-Zionist resolution, equating Zionism with racism, the American Zionist Federation has developed a major Zionist Information and Education Program to be implemented throughout the United States, it was announced by Dr. Samuel I. Cohen, Executive Director of the AZF.

HAIFA -- The 120-member Faculty Senate of the Technion - Israel Institute of Technology unanimously passed this week a resolution urging their colleagues at universities throughout the world to press for repeal of the anti-Zionist position adopted recently by the United Nations General Assembly.

NEW YORK -- Stanley H. Lowell, Chairman of the National Conference on Soviet Jewry, announced that Ilya Glezer, a Soviet Jewish Prisoner of Conscience has been appointed a Professor in the Department of Biological Sciences at Ben-Gurion University of the Negev.

NEW YORK -- The First National Orthodox Leadership Conference on Public Affairs, held under the auspices of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America, attracted over 600 participants during the course of its two-day program.

NEW YORK -- The American National Standards Institute, 1430 Broadway, N.Y.C. 10018, announces the recent publication of a new National Standard for the Romanization of Hebrew.

DETROIT (WNS) -- Urging Jewish organizational and Zionist leaders to replace "statements and declarations with real efforts and actions," Israeli Tourism Minister Moshe Kol declared that the 1975 aliya figure of 20,000 from all parts of the world "is one of the Zionist movement's and the State of Israel's greatest tragedies."

LOS ANGELES (WNS) -- Gov. Edmund G. Brown, Jr., has been commended by the Pacific Southwest Regional office of B'nai B'rith's Anti-Defamation League for ending a plan to send California state highway engineers, who were slated for layoffs in 1976, to Saudi Arabia because of the refusal by the Saudis to admit any person with Zionist beliefs.
