

ISRAEL URGES

there was any change in the Israeli position. Meanwhile 18 Third World Countries introduced a resolution into the General Assembly which calls on all countries "to desist from supplying Israel with any military or economic aid as long as it continues to occupy Arab territories and denies the inalienable national rights to the Palestinian people." The resolution requests the Security Council to implement all relevant resolutions of the Council and the General Assembly and to include the PLO in the process of working out a Mideast settlement.

Both Herzog and American Ambassador W. Tapley Bennett Jr., called the draft "one-sided" and harmful to the pursuit of a Mideast peace. Herzog said Israel would not be bound by the resolution if it was adopted. He said the resolution eliminates any mention of negotiations and said that no progress can be made without peace talks. Bennett said the resolution also makes efforts for a settlement difficult. He said the U.S. is ready to help further negotiations between Syria and Israel and was ready "to consult and discuss the possibility of a reconvened Geneva conference." Bennett declared that "the task before us all is to get to the serious work of negotiations among the parties in which real progress can be made. Resolutions such as the one before us can only exacerbate the situation."

JEWISH SUMMIT OPENS IN JERUSALEM

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A world Jewish "summit" opened at the Knesset building here with 170 delegates from abroad and scores of Israelis attending in an effort to increase Jewish unity in the wake of the anti-Zionist and anti-Jewish resolutions adopted by the United Nations General Assembly.

The conference was called by Premier Yitzhak Rabin and acting World Zionist Organization chairman Leon Dulzin after the UN vote linking Zionism with racism. Dulzin opened the conference with a warning that "without greatly increased aliya there can be no security for Israel, no future, no Israel." He said Israel must have a population of seven to eight million Jews by the end of the century. Dulzin also urged greater Jewish identification and increased education for Jewish children in the diaspora. He said the basic answer to the anti-Zionist resolution "is in what we are and what we do as Jews in Israel and in our Jewish communities in the diaspora."

Rabin called on world Jewry for a "decisive response" to the "obscene" attack on Israel, the Jewish people and Judaism which he attributed to a Soviet-Arab conspiracy in the UN and the rest of the world. He said the coming year must be "a year of unprecedented Jewish Commitment." Former Foreign Minister Abba Eban urged American Jews to "give us one-third of one percent in each year" meaning 20,000 olim instead of the present 4,000 who make aliya each year from the United States.

The summit meeting called for a series of conferences of Jewish and non-Jewish intellectuals to be held in the United States, Canada, South America, Europe and England. It also urged that the next Yom Haatzmaut (Israel Independence Day) which will be on May 5, 1976 be celebrated by world Jewry with an unprecedented display of vigor and unity. There were also proposals for a worldwide campaign to sign a declaration of identification with Zionism and Israel; a buy-Israeli-produce campaign; a move to urge Jewish organizations and individuals to visit Israel in 1976; a program to send 30,000 young volunteers to Israel next year, and to introduce Hebrew into high school curricula abroad.

Many delegates from abroad were angered that the proposals were prepared before their arrival. They said this meant the issues were resolved before they had a chance to state their views. Many delegates said the conference was too hastily planned and did not represent the views of unaffiliated Jews. Others said the size of the conference was too large for practical discussions. "This is preaching to the converted," one American leader said. "The people here are all committed, all Zionists, all Israel-lovers, all doers..."

FORD SAYS PLO MUST RECOGNIZE ISRAEL

WASH. - (WNS) --

President Ford told a televised press conference that there will be no progress toward a Middle East peace unless the Palestinians recognize the State of Israel.

"The Palestinians do not recognize the State of Israel and under the circumstances it's impossible to bring the Palestinians and the Israelis together to negotiate," he said. "So unless there is some change in this attitude, I think you can see a very serious roadblock exists."

U.S. STOPS DISTRIBUTING ARAB DEALS WITH BOYCOTT RESTRICTIONS

WASH. (WNS) -- A House - Senate conference committee has approved an amendment to the United States foreign economic aid bill to counter discrimination by Arab governments against American Jews, Blacks and women.

The amendment directs the President not to take into account on assigning officers or employees of the U.S. to serve in any foreign country, their race, religion, national origin or sex. It said that such assignments "shall be made solely on the basis of ability and relevant experience."

Sen. Clifford P. Case (R. N.J.) who authored the amendment, said the conference committee, by its approval "put teeth into the effort" to prohibit discrimination against Americans by countries "wishing to receive our assistance." The conference committee action came shortly after President Ford announced regulations designed to protect Americans against discrimination such as the Arab boycott.
