The current administration of Ford and Kissinger is not only strangling Israel step by step, but also selling out the American public

to the Russian takeover of the Mideast.

The latest scam by the Administration is bringing about American recognition of the Palestine Liberation Organization, along with pressure on Israel to negotiate with Arafat, providing the PLODECLARES THAT IT RECOG-NIZES THE EXISTENCE OF ISRAEL.

Israelite Ads Pay

States of a United Nations Security Council resolution condemning Israel for its air raids terrorist strongholds in Lebanon was welcomed with satisfaction by the Israeli govern-

A Foreign Ministry spokesman said the U.S. had prevented another one-sided resolution which ignored the "abominable crimes" of the terrorist organizations. Thirteen of the 15 Council members voted for the resolution, with Costa Rica abstaining, and the U.S. casting the only negative vote which constituted a veto.

U.S. Ambassador Daniel P. Moynihan told the Council that the U.S. was a mediator in the Middle East conflict and could only support an evenhanded resolution. When proposed American amendments including terrorist raids along with Israel in the condemnation were rejected, Moynihan received approval from Secretary of State

Henry A. Kissinger to veto the resolution. Israel Ambassador Chaim Herzog, who boy-cotted the Council meeting because of the presence of the Palestine Liberation Organization, applauded the veto as an act of common decency against discrimination. He accused the other members of the Council of a lack of morality, noting that they had earlier opposed U.S. efforts to balance the resolution with a condemnation of terrorist acts. British Ambassador Ivor Richard, the Council's president, said he voted for the resolution because there could be no justification for attacks on the scale of the Israel:

Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa.

And there are Christmas trees, too!

No one asked but an innocuous wire service story, datelined Vatican City, and printed in the local press may have caused some concern amount our paid

amoung our neighbors.

The story quotes a Vatican weekly newspaper saying Santa Claus represents a "monstrous substitution" for the Christ child and "offends the faith.'

The editorial in L'Osservatore delle Do-menica also assailed the Christmas tree as "an attempt to substitute for the crib. . . and a certain sense of naturalism and paganism.

The objection apparently stems from the gen-eral public's acceptance of St. Nick and the tree as indicative of the holiday to the gradual exclusion of the true religious conception, the Nati-

strict religious interpretation of the Holy day should unquestionably be total reverence and complete compliance with the Holy Writ. Those devout souls among us always have and will continue to adhere to the rigid theological celebration of the occasion and no amount of persuasion

(if attempted) could dissuade them.

But Christmas Day with no distraction from all the solemnity it stands for, has, through the centuries grown, expanded, magnified into a spirit of Christmas. What started as a one-day observance is now a weeks-long holiday. What began with personal greetings of cheer from one to another is now the exchange of hundreds of millions of cards expressing joy. What commen-ced as an occasion for the discreet dispensation of charity for the less fortunate has developed into the indescriminate giving and receiving of gifts. The once simple recreation of one's version of the Crib has developed into addenda like trees, holly wreaths, tinsel and lights. An occasion that was originally celebrated by

just those of the Christian faith, now finds other sects, religions and beliefs looking forward to and rejoicing in the spirit of Christmas.

The metamorphosis of Christmas was not a straight, smooth road from the way it was, to what it is. There were bypaths, drawbacks, tangents and obstacles created by the natural course of history through the ages.
