as well as visiting Israeli Tourism Minister Moshe Kol.

But in Jerusalem it was reported that government officials had been saying privately that it had been agreed that Mexico would vote for the women's year resolution since it had been the host country for the conference. But questions were raised why the government had not informed the Knesset, the press and American Jewish leaders of this.

The Mexican vote was explained at the UN by the head of that country's delegation, Ms. Aida Gonzales Martinez, who said her government supported the Mexico City declaration as being of considerable value. She said if Zionism means the realization of the national aspirations of the Jewish people, her delegation's vote on the whole resolution should not be interpreted as accepting the equation set forth in the two anti-Zionist paragraphs. She did not explain, however, why Mexico supported these paragraphs in the separate vote. Israeli Ambassador Chaim Herzog, who denounced the resolution's anti-Zionist sections as "an international scandal of major proportions," said that the original purpose of the International Women's Year has the full support of Israel and that Israel would continue its policy of "promoting and maintaining the rights of women."

JEWISH TOURS TO BARBADOS, NOT MEXICO

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- Barbados, one of Israel's most faithful friends here at the UN and which was in the forefront in the battle against the infamous November 10 resolution, is becoming a tourist mecca for Jewish visitors.

According to the Encyclopaedia Judaica, "the first Jewish settlers in Barbados were ex-Marranos who escaped from Brazil after its reconquest from the Dutch by the Portuguese. Jews in Barbados prospered for more than 200 years, and many reminders of the once active Jewish life on the island-nation

can still be found. Today, the small Jewish community of Barbados is made up primarily of immigrants who arrived there as a result of the Nazi holocaust.

The island, with an idyllic year-round climate, has long been a magnet for visitors, and George Washington was among the first to go there. Barbados was the only foreign country he ever visited.

The Barbados Board of Tourism maintains an office at 800 Second Avenue, New York City -- the same building which houses the Israeli Mission to the United Nations.

NEW ANTI-ISRAEL COMMITTEE ON UN'S LAST DAY

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- The closing day of the 30th session, Wednesday, December 17, the General Assembly appointed an Arab-inspired new 20-member anti-Israeli committee on the basis of a resolution adopted on the November 10th day of infamy which witnessed the approval also of a second draft that equated Zionism with racism.

The sponsors of the new committee headed by Senegal had tried in vain to include at least one Western delegation in the new unit. Every Western state they approached refused to serve in the body.

The pro-PLO committee, according to the instructions of the November 10th resolution, has the specific task of preparing a program aimed at the implementation of the rights of the Pales-

tinians under PLO leadership which, in effect, means the undoing of Israel as a sovereign state.

The 20 members of this latest anti-Israeli UN body include Afghanistan, Cuba, Cyprus, East Germany, Guinea, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Laos, Madagascar, Malaysia, Malta, Pakistan, Rumania, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Tunisia, Turkey, the Ukraine and Yugoslavia.

The Assembly resolution instructs the committee to submit a report with recommendations by June 1, 1976. One need not guess what this report will contain.

In the meantime, all eyes here are focused on the Security Council which is scheduled to take up the Middle East situation on January 12, 1976, with PLO participation. Despite pressures

from many countries that they attend the Israelis have indicated that they plan to boycott the Council meetings.

PALESTINIAN PROBLEM SHOULD BE TOLD TO THE WORLD

NEW YORK (WNS)

-- Israel has presented the Palestinian problem "poorly" to world public opinion, Leon Dulzin, acting chairman of the World Zionist Organization and Jewish Agency Executives, told a meeting of the National Executive Committee of the Zionist Organization of America.

Dulzin said Israel should have pointed out that historic Palestine includes both sides of the Jordan River and therefore "all the people in Jordan are Palestinians including King Hussein."

However, Dulzin said the real issue in the Middle East is not the Palestinians but the refusal

of the Arab states to recognize the existence of Israel. Dulzin, a leader of the Liberal Party one of the components of the Likud opposition, accused Premier Yitzhak Rabin's government of being the weakest in Israeli history and called for a government of national unity including Likud.

He also accused Rabin of trying to dictate the election of the next chairman of the Jewish Agency,

WZO by picking personally the Labor Party's candidate for the dual posts. Dulzin, who is seeking to be elected to the chairmanships,

did not name his opponent but he was apparently referring to Haifa Mayor Yosef Almogi.
